General Election Returns**

The Board of Canvassers of Millcreek, Utah, met in a public meeting on December 5, 2023 at City Hall, located at 1330 E. Chambers Avenue, Millcreek, UT 84106. The meeting was live streamed via the City's website.

**1. Canvass the Returns of the Municipal General Election**

Chair Silvestrini called the meeting to order. The General Election Returns were opened and reviewed by the Board. Elyse Sullivan noted that the final election results were received that afternoon from the Salt Lake County Clerk's Office. She briefly explained the canvass statistics and short report provided by the County. There were 3,889 ballots (40.1%) counted from 9,702 eligible registered voters. There were 88 ballots that were not opened for various reasons, such as they contained a bad signature or they came in past the deadline. The terms on the report were explained per the County as follows:

- Blanks indicates the number of ballots where the contest in question was completely blank, no rankings filled out.
- Exhausted indicates how many ballots in each phase can no longer be counted because they have run out of ranked candidates. For example, if I ranked two candidates, and then left the rest unranked, my ballot would be exhausted after the second phase if my candidates were eliminated as part of the tabulation process. However, there were none as the race did not go into a second round of voting.
- Overvotes are when more than one candidate is selected for each rank. For example, if I ranked two candidates as my first choice, I would have an overvote in the first phase and that rank and anything after that would not be counted.
- Threshold indicates the number of votes required for a candidate to cross the 50% line.

Sullivan declared Cheri Jackson elected as the first candidate with more than 50% of the votes for Council District 3 (with 2,884 votes or 76.22%).

Board Member DeSirant moved to accept and approve the Millcreek General Election results as provided by the Salt Lake County Clerk's Office and confirm the Election Officer's declaration of Cheri Jackson as elected to the office of Council District 3. Board Member Uipi seconded the motion. The City Recorder called for the vote. Board Member Catten voted yes, Board Member DeSirant voted yes, Board Member Jackson voted yes, Board Member Uipi voted yes, and Chair Silvestrini voted yes. The motion passed unanimously.

## 2. Approval of November 16, 2021 Meeting Minutes

Board Member Uipi moved to approve item 2. Board Member Jackson seconded the motion. The City Recorder called for the vote. Board Member Catten voted yes, Board Member DeSirant voted yes, Board Member Jackson voted yes, Board Member Uipi voted yes, and Chair Silvestrini voted yes. The motion passed unanimously.

**ADJOURNED:** Board Member DeSirant moved to adjourn the meeting at 5:12 p.m. Board Member Uipi seconded. Chair Silvestrini called for the vote. Board Member Catten voted yes, Board Member DeSirant voted yes, Board Member Jackson voted yes, Board Member Uipi voted yes, and Chair Silvestrini voted yes. The motion passed unanimously.
