EMERGENCY HAM RADIO IN MILLCREEK

MILLCREEK. Millcreek resident Norman Ross belongs to a ham radio operator group that helps with communications in the event of a disaster or emergency event. Recently, a construction incident damaged a critical cable near I-80, which affected cell phone and internet service for more than a day in Tooele County. Ross and his group dispatched licensed mobile and portable ham radio operators to assist with communications outside the area.

Ross explains how the ordinary citizen can join the group: "Step one: Join a ham radio classes, take and pass the FCC license test, and receive your ham radio operator's license. (I always tell folks if they can pass high school math or physics they can study and pass easily!). Step two is to purchase an inexpensive ham radio, car mount magnetic antenna, and a spare radio battery or lighter-socket plug. Plenty of hams are willing to help new arrivals. They're called Elmers. (I don't

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know why.) Then sign up to help in emergencies or events ... that's about all there is to it." Ross assures that "ham radio is NOTHING like CB!"

RED CROSS DISASTER TRAINING

Participants will be American Red Cross Shelter Certified.

MILLCREEK MOVES TO STREAMLINE CONSIDERATION OF PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Millcreek's new Planning Commission met for the first time last Wednesday in a formal meeting to review applications. The new commission has seven members, and two alternates. Tom Stephens, who chaired the former Millcreek Township Planning Commission, was reelected as chair for 2017. The Planning Commission will meet on the third Wednesday of every month in the Salt Lake County Council Chambers, 2001 South State Street, Room N1-110.

In a first step toward streamlining consideration of conditional use applications, Millcreek's community councils have agreed to change their regular meeting dates to the first week of each month. This will allow applications for conditional uses to be reviewed by the community councils in time to present their recommendations to the Planning Commission two weeks later.

Public Comment Policy and Procedure: The purpose of public comment is to allow citizens to address items on the agenda. Citizens requesting to address the commission will be asked to complete a written comment form and present it to the acting city recorder. In general, the chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
