MSD Feasibility Study Results to be Presented

MILLCREEK. The feasibility study required by state law to consider leaving the Municipal Services District ("MSD") will be presented for the first time to the City Council on Monday, April 24th. We will post the study on Tuesday on the City's website <https://millcreek.utah.gov/notices/>, and it will be available after Tuesday at the City's offices, 3932 South 500 East, and at the Millcreek Library, 2266 East Evergreen Ave.

You can attend your local community council meeting in May to ask questions of city representatives and the study consultants (Lewis Young), and offer your comments.

The Council will hold a public hearing on May 23, 2017, 6:30 p.m. at Wasatch Jr. High Auditorium (3750 South 3100 East, Millcreek, UT 84109) to formally present the study, answer questions, and take comment.

PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY AND PROCEDURE: The purpose of public comment is to allow citizens to address items on the agenda. In general, the chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
