Dumpster Cleanup Will Be Here At The End Of Summer through September

MILLCREEK. Millcreek residents have long enjoyed the annual dumpster clean-up. In the past, it was July when the Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District (WFWRD) delivered dumpsters to curbs in most of our neighborhoods

This year, dumpster deliveries will take place August 29th through September 29th.

The Fireworks Discussion Goes On

MILLCREEK. Cottonwood Heights was in the news this week for passing a complete ban on aerial fireworks everywhere within their city limits. Many of our residents have insisted that Millcreek follow suit. Here is what state law says about how far cities can go in regulating fireworks:

The fire marshal first must find that "hazardous environmental conditions necessitate controlled use of any ignition source, including fireworks..." [Utah Code section 15A-5-202.5](#). If the fire marshal makes that determination, then cities can prohibit fireworks, but only in "mountainous, brush-covered, or forest-covered areas or the wildland urban interface area, which means the line, area, or zone where structures or other human development meet or intermingle with undeveloped wildland or land being used for an agricultural purpose." [Id.](#)

The Unified Fire Authority (Millcreek's "fire marshal") has not declared that fireworks should be prohibited everywhere in Millcreek. Instead, based on historical data and current conditions, the UFA has identified specific areas it believes meet the requirements of state law. In turn, Millcreek has enacted an ordinance that bans fireworks in the areas the UFA has identified. From time to time, the UFA has identified and informed us of additional sites. All currently identified sites are included in Millcreek's ban.


In addition, regardless of where you are shooting off your fireworks, the negligent use of fireworks anywhere in the city is prohibited. Negligent parties who cause damage can be held fully responsible for reparations.




The maps below (excerpted from the UFA's [Interactive Fireworks Restrictions Map](#)) depict the restricted areas in Millcreek where using fireworks is prohibited.

(North is to the left.) Consistent with the UFA's recommendations, Millcreek's ordinance also bans fireworks in unrestricted areas of the City that are within 300 feet of vacant lots and undeveloped land. [Click here](#) to review Millcreek's ordinance. Here are the restricted areas:


Everywhere east of I-215 / Wasatch Blvd.

East and West of Highland Drive



Here are some precautions for enjoying fireworks, especially when the conditions are dry:

- Use fireworks only in locations allowed by Millcreek's ordinance.
- Choose a shooting site that is concrete, asphalt, or hard-packed dirt.
- Clean up combustible grass, dry leaves and brush from the shooting site.
- Before using fireworks, water down the shooting site to a 25-foot radius.
- Have a ready supply of water or a fire extinguisher on hand.
- Sober adults should handle and fire the fireworks.
- Soak used fireworks with water; don't melt your garbage can.

Do NOT use fireworks in any prohibited site. Call [911](#), the UPD [385-468-9620](#), or Sergeant Brent Davis, [385-468-9642](#), to report illegal fireworks.

We understand that Rep. Jani Iwamoto has opened a bill file at the Legislature, and met with many of the stakeholders to discuss whether current state fireworks laws are adequate or appropriate. The Salt Lake Tribune reports that [House Speaker Greg Hughes favors local control over an outright state ban of fireworks](#). We will continue to follow the issue and keep you posted.



I-80/I-215 Lane Closures

You can probably already tell that travel from I-80 onto I-215 and vice versa is mess during certain times of the day. This weekend, travel in each direction will be reduced to one lane. Starting Monday, July 17th, the lane restrictions on both east- and west-bound I-80 between 1300 East and Foothill Drive will last from 7 pm to 7 am. Foothill Drive southbound to I-215 still remains closed (until September!).

UDOT has decided that the 1300 East and 700 East exits aren't big enough to accommodate all of the detoured traffic, so you're on your own. Maybe try UDOT's marked detour for southbound Foothill Drive. That's I-80 west to I-15 south to the east-bound I-215 interchange at 6400 South, and back east up the hill to northbound I-215. The map is below. That's quite a distance for, say, folks in the Canyon Rim area trying to get home from the U!
