### **First Year Celebration is Launchpad for the "Millcreek Promise" Initiative**

MILLCREEK. Earlier this week, Millcreek celebrated its first birthday. Addressing the large crowd, Mayor Silvestrini outlined the progress the city has made over the past year, with many services having been brought in-house and advantageous contracts made with Salt Lake County for other services. With basic services now under control, Mayor Silvestrini and the City Council have turned their attention to bridging divides and building stronger relationships across our diverse community. The "Millcreek Promise" initiative is designed to mobilize Millcreek residents to help all Millcreek youth and families to be successful in the areas of:

- **Education:** Maximizing academic success and educational outcomes to ensure that all of our children have the opportunity to read on grade level, and graduate with the prospect of college or trade school.
- **Health:** Creating a safer, healthier community through resident engagement, support of local law enforcement, and partnerships with health providers.

- **Economics:** Enhancing the economic well-being of Millcreek residents who are unemployed or underemployed, or who have had life experiences that have denied them access to education or vocational training, to help them become better able to provide for themselves and their families.

Designed after South Salt Lake's Promise Program, the Millcreek Promise initiative will be funded almost entirely with grants and contributions, not at taxpayer expense. It will rely upon the rich volunteer traditions of our community, and match our residents' talents to the needs of our community.



The Council's intent is for Millcreek Promise to build connections and heal divides across our community, while it mitigates issues that many of our city's young people and families face. We invite you as residents, business owners, parents, school representatives, and nonprofit and faith community members to join the effort. We will all benefit from a community richer in shared and diverse tradition, a community which is safer, more connected and more prosperous.

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## Canyon Rim Symposia Series Features Neighborhood Stories and Adventurers

MILLCREEK. For the past couple of years, Millcreek resident Nate Gibby has organized a series of neighborhood symposia in Canyon Rim. Gibby describes the Canyon Rim Symposia Series as "a grassroots effort to provide general interest presentations on lifestyle and general interest topics in an effort to connect neighbors and strengthen the Canyon Rim neighborhood." Last year, symposia attendees learned about beekeeping and were regaled by the adventures of a former astronaut who lives in Millcreek.

Next week, the Canyon Rim Symposia Series features Millcreek residents Jennifer Jordan and Jeff Rhoads, who will present the harrowing untold story of Dudley Wolfe's fatal 1939 expedition to K-2. With an elevation within 800' of Everest, K2 has a reputation as being the most dangerous mountain in the world.

Jordan and her husband, Rhoads, went on their own expedition to K-2 in 2002, and found the remains of Wolfe during their adventure. Jordan, an award-winning author and journalist, has written several books and documentaries about K2. Rhoads is an award-winning filmmaker and record-holding mountaineer. *K2: The Deadly Mountain*, will take place on Thursday, January 18th, at 7PM, 3051 South 2900 East.
