OFF-LEASH DOGS ARE PROHIBITED ON CITY STREETS

MILLCREEK. Whether the discussion is about dogs [on our trails](#) or about dogs [in our neighborhoods](#), Millcreek residents have strong opinions about dog leashes.

Here's what the law says. On incorporation, [Millcreek adopted](#) Salt Lake County's leash laws. By law, a dog cannot run at large in Millcreek at any time. [SLCo. Ord. 8.04.130](#). That means owners shouldn't let their dogs out the front door to run freely throughout the neighborhood.

Additionally, dogs must be on-leash "in all developed areas" of Millcreek. That includes our residential neighborhoods, streets and sidewalks, playgrounds, parking lots, and parks. [SLCo. Ord. 8.04.170](#). That means your dog must be on a leash when you take him or her for a walk.

Two of the best off-leash dog areas in Salt Lake County are immediately available to Millcreek residents--Millcreek Canyon on odd-numbered days, and [large areas of Parleys Historic Nature Park](#).

The trails on Grandeur Peak, Neff's Cayon and Mt. Olympus are also off-leash dog areas. [Click here for a copy of the Salt Lake County District Attorney's opinion](#) on this issue.

If your dogs are off-leash, you must able to control them immediately. [SLCo Ord. 8.01.010](#) (which defines "animal at-large")

Also, regardless of where you take your dogs, you must clean up after them. This isn't just common courtesy, but a requirement of the law.

If you are having a problem with a dog habitually off-leash, you can call Salt Lake County Animal Services at [385-468-7387](#). Some people have suggested that we spend more resources on enforcement activities. What do you think? Are you willing to pay for that? You can weigh in by responding to this email.

UTAH LEGISLATURE HONORS SKYLINE HIGH ASL TEACHER

MILLCREEK. Jody Lynn Tolley, who teaches American Sign Language (ASL) at Skyline High, [was honored by special citation on the floor of the Utah Senate](#) this past legislative season. She, together with many of her students and several officials and students from the Utah Schools for the Deaf and Blind, appeared in support of [Senate Joint Resolution 1](#), Recognizing Educators of the Deaf and American Sign Language Instructors.

Ms. Tolley has been teaching ASL at Skyline since 2007. Senator Jani Iwamoto (who represents most of Millcreek) sponsored the resolution. Her daughter transferred from Olympus to Skyline in large part because she wanted to study ASL. Senator Iwamoto expressed gratitude to Ms. Tolley for not only teaching the language, but for helping ASL students become better human beings. This past year, Ms. Tolley's students prepared to put on a play in sign language about teenage suicide. They ended up canceling the performance out of respect for the family of a Skyline student who actually did commit suicide.

We join Senator Iwamoto and the Utah Legislature in thanking Ms. Tolley.

GREEN WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM TO START SOON



MILLCREEK. The Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District will resume its weekly Green Waste Collection Program on normal collection days starting the week of March 19th. This is a subscription program that helps divert green waste from the landfill to be processed into mulch. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
