MILLCREEK. About 30 owners of businesses in Millcreek gathered together at City Hall earlier this week to discuss how they could help each other, how the City could help them, and how they could help the City. They met with various officials from the City, including our new Economic Development Director Mike Winder, as well as Sgt. M. Mays from the Millcreek Precinct UPD and Aimee McConkie with VentureOut!

Rather than forming a formal chamber of commerce, the attendees liked the idea of the "Millcreek Business Council." They envision quarterly meetings like this week's, where businesses of all types can get together to share feedback and get the update on what is happening in the City.

PRIORITIZING ROAD REPAIRS IS A BALANCING ACT

MILLCREEK. Overlays, including improvements to gutters and runoff control, will be applied to a number of roads in Millcreek this summer. Overlay work on the roads marked on the map above will begin in the next couple of weeks. This particular project is the next phase of the overlay that was done last summer to the east of this area.

Last year, Millcreek adopted a several year long pavement preservation plan that was designed before incorporation. Identifying which roads in the City to

repair and how to repair them is a complicated process. The life of any road can be extended by repaving it from time to time. But a road can reach the point where repaving it no longer works, and a complete rebuild is required.

Every third year, the condition of each road in Millcreek is objectively rated on an Operational Condition Index (OCI). On a scale of 0 to 100, the optimal timing for repaving is before a road reaches 70 OCI.

Prioritizing through OCI would be the best way to maintain the life of roads for as long as possible. But funds are not always available to keep every road in optimal shape. Complete rebuilds are very expensive, and those projects must be worked into the budget many years ahead of actual construction.

Roads that have passed the point where repaving no longer works are not on the map. For example, the life of 39th South above 23rd East cannot be extended by simple repaving. For now, potholes will be repaired and small fixes completed until capital funding for a total repair is available. On all roads in Millcreek, potholes reported to the Operations Division at (385) 468-6100 are almost always repaired within 72 hours.

Ultimately, prioritizing street repairs is a balancing act in which the urgency of the problems created by the road defect must be considered, along with the OCI and funding availability.

So when you see that the really bad roads are not being fixed, or an annoying issue you've reported is taking longer than you want to be addressed, remember that there is a plan to spread the money around. We want to keep the good roads in optimal condition so they don't tip over the edge of no return. We want to take care of immediately dangerous issues. And in the midst of it all, we are working on grants or budgeting capital for the really large projects. **(More in a future newsletter about the \$5.4 million the Wasatch Front Regional Council awarded yesterday for future Millcreek projects -- hooray!)**
