MILLCREEK. Seventy-five years ago, the East Mill Creek Lions Club received its charter. Since then, its July 4th community celebration has delighted residents of Millcreek with chuck-wagon breakfasts, parades down Evergreen Avenue, and carnivals.

Entertaining at least 3,500 observers and participants, this year's parade was comprised of red-white-blue-stars-and-stripes-clad local bicycle, tricycle, scooter, and stroller riders of many different ages, dressed-up critters, children's dance troupes, a couple of former presidents in stove-pipe hats, elected officials, police and fire officers and vehicles, and hand-pulled floats. The parade theme this year honored the East Mill Creek Lions' diamond anniversary.
