

SANITATION IN A DISASTER



MILLCREEK. Did you know that "human waste is one of the deadliest substances on earth. Where sanitation is poor, death & disease are rampant." This is a quote from Kathy McMullin, aka "The First Responder Mom". Kathy will be teaching "Sanitation in a Disaster" at the Valley View Stake Center, 2245 East 3900 South, on **Thurs., August 2nd** at 7pm.

In Kathy's class, you will be educated on all aspects of sanitation. You'll learn how to set up a temporary bathroom, as well as how to prevent hydrogen sulfide from entering your home. (Did you know that could be a problem?) You'll also discuss pesticides and cleansers. This experience will be eye-opening, even to the most seasoned emergency responder.

Everyone 14 and older is invited attend. Kathy is a critical infrastructure specialist with the Utah State Division of Emergency Management. She is a member of the State Emergency Response Team (SERT) and is trained in Critical Thinking Analytic Methods with the Department of Homeland Security and Advanced Critical Infrastructure Protection from the Emergency Management Institute.

UDOT'S PARLEYS INTERCHANGE PLANS COULD SPELL DISASTER FOR PARTS OF MILLCREEK

MILLCREEK. Last week, we published a Call to Action by Mayor Silvestrini and Mount Olympus Community Council Chair David Baird, asking Millcreek residents to **comment by August 10th** on UDOT's current plans to alter the Parleys Canyon interchange. As we pointed out last week, UDOT's plans could severely limit or eliminate the Grandeur Peak Trailhead, risk severely narrow or eliminate the northern part of Wasatch Blvd, and could take out homes along that same part of Wasatch Blvd.
