Slurry Seal Work Scheduled

MILLCREEK. It's the time of year for slurry seal pavement preservation operations. "Slurry" means applying an oil and aggregate (usually sand) mixture on an existing asphalt road.

Wasatch Boulevard is Going to be Cleaned, and Beautified with Landscaping near Millstream Lane

MILLCREEK. Each year for the past five years, neighbors in the Mt. Olympus Community Council area have joined together to cleanup and beautify their community. Their most visible projects in the past have involved picking up trash and pulling weeds on Wasatch Boulevard.

This year, the project also includes planting drought tolerant trees and shrubs in

the vacant plot on Wasatch Boulevard just north of Millstream Lane.

Last winter, with funding allocated by the County prior to incorporation, the City installed metered water in this plot to support the [landscaping plan shown here](#). **The planting project will be funded entirely by donations from the community**, which will be accepted at Millcreek City Hall. Granite School District leads the way with idle-free technology...

[REPRINTED FROM [GRANITE SCHOOL DISTRICT BLOG](#)]. The new school year began with idle-free technology installed on 40 buses—nearly a third of the entire fleet.

Granite is the first school district in Utah to install the Utah-invented and patented Idle Free Heat Technology in its buses. This was made possible through grant funding from the Utah Clean Air Partnership (UCAIR) Grant Program with matching funds from the district and Idle Free Heat.

As we enter into the cooler fall months, the Idle Free Heat system solves the drivers' dilemma of having to idle when waiting for school pickups to keep the heat flowing into the vehicle. Idle Free Heat harnesses the heat that is normally wasted away when the vehicle is off and recirculates it through the vehicle's vents, providing heat for up to an hour—all while producing zero emissions and using zero fuel.

Installation of the idle free technology was made possible through the UCAIR Grant Program to fund innovative projects that have significant impact on improving air quality. Funding for the grant program comes from private donations.

Backyard GardenShare

MILLCREEK. Across the valley, neighbors are donating and helping to distribute fresh surplus garden fruits and vegetables to those in need. Dozens of Millcreek volunteers are participating.

Backyard GardenShare is a program started in 2016 in several neighborhoods in Salt Lake County. The 7,000 pounds of produce collected that year more than quadrupled in 2017, when 30,000 pounds were collected and distributed free to local organizations such as schools, Boys and Girls Clubs, emergency pantries, soup kitchens, refugee centers, and subsidized housing complexes.

At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
