Millcreek Obtains More Funding for Additional Bike Lanes

MILLCREEK. To accommodate various modes of transportation and make our neighborhoods safer, Millcreek recently applied for funding from the County's Active Transportation Network Improvement Program (CATNIP). We asked for funds to design and install bike lanes and neighborhood byways designated on the City's Active Transportation Implementation Plan (ATIP). All four of Millcreek's applications were selected and 100% funded in the combined amount of \$90,000. Designs of new bike lanes are underway for portions of Upland, Jupiter, Brockbank, and Siggard Drives, each of which is on Millcreek's ATIP.

The new bike lanes will be designated with occasional wayfinding signage and by paint along the existing shoulders of the roadways. They will be designated as either mark bike lanes or "sharrows" (Share the Road). Generally, bike lanes will be installed in uphill sections where bicycles travel slower and "sharrows" in downhill sections when bicyclist and maintain speeds close to the posted speed, typically 25mph.

We're all familiar with bike lanes, which are designated areas for bicyclists to travel between two painted lines. Just like you can't park in a regular car travel lane, you can't park in a bike lane. A "sharrow" (Share the Road) allows a bicyclist to occupy the regular car travel lane and have the right-of-way. State law allows a bicyclist to occupy the lane without the "sharrow" markings,

however, the pavement marking helps to remind the driver and bicyclist to share the road.

Parking is allowed on the shoulder of of the road marked with bike lanes or "sharrows", as long as you park between the gutter and the white line. Areas where there isn't enough room to park will be signed as "No Parking".

Active transportation plans are an important component of a transportation network and provide residents who choose to commute and/or recreate by bicycle the ability to do so more safely alongside cars. Bike lane or "sharrow" markings also remind drivers that they may encounter cyclists and should travel at the posted speed limit.

MILLCREEK. Last month the Wasatch Front Waste and Recycling District conducted a survey of how you feel about continued recycling services in light of the difficulties caused by China's recent rejection of waste materials. The survey is complete and the results have been tallied.

More than 1,600 Millcreek residents responded, with an overwhelming 85% indicating continued support of recycling services. Overall, 79.91% of all respondents support continued recycling services, and 70.5% would support a fee increase in the future to maintain recycling services.

Reminder: Ongoing Fall Leaf Collection

MILLCREEK. The annual Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District (WFRD) **Fall Leaf Collection Program will run October 15 through November 30.**

Millcreek residents can pick up leaf bags at the following locations:

- Calvin Smith Library: 810 E. 3300 S.
- Millcreek City Hall: 3330 S. 1300 E.
- Millcreek Recreation Center: 2230 E. Evergreen Ave.
- Olympus Fire Station: 3612 E. 3900 S.
- Millcreek Activity Center: 4405 S. 1025 E.

Filled leaf bags can be dropped off at:

- Canyon Rim Park: 3100 E. 3100 S.
- Cottonwood Ball Complex: 4400 S 1300 E.

WFRD leaf bags are limited to 10 bags per household, and available while supplies last. Residents can also use and drop off their own purchased leaf bags or lawn bags. **ONLY LEAVES PLEASE! NO OTHER TRASH.**

Important tips from Millcreek City's Stormwater Engineer, Dan Drumiler, P.E.:


MILLCREEK. Due to some recent flash flood events in our city, it is important to remind residents to keep yards, curbs & gutters, sidewalks, and driveways free of dirt, leaves and other materials. This will prevent these materials from washing down the gutter during storm events and clogging a catch basin grate (see photo below).



A clogged grate prevents storm water from entering the storm drain system and leads to flooding of property, including landscaping, driveways, garages, and basements. If you live next to a catch basin, please clean the grate as needed and dispose of the material. For more severe clogging of both the grate and catch basin, please call the city at 801-214-2700 for scheduling of maintenance.
