### **City Council Asked to Consider Public Fiber Network**

MILLCREEK. Over the last several months, Millcreek has received more than 100 inquiries about the feasibility of building a municipal fiber optic network that would be fast, open, and available to residents and business owners.

Many of the inquirers sent us a [link to a TedxSalt Lake City video](#) given by local entrepreneur Jeff Christensen. In his Tedx talk, Christensen contends that most cities' current internet infrastructure is outdated, and controlled by just a few companies.

Christensen suggests that cities can adopt methods to disrupt this monopoly, consider internet access as a utility, update the infrastructure, and provide its citizens with faster and more economical access to the internet.

Many of us are aware of the UTOPIA fiber optic network that was adopted and built a few years ago by several Utah municipalities. At a recent conference of Utah cities and towns, UTOPIA made a presentation wherein it acknowledged "several hiccups" with the program as initially rolled out, but indicated that things have since changed dramatically.

The City Council has no current, or even potentially anticipated, intent to expend any tax dollars to create a fiber optic network in Millcreek. Other strategies, however, may be reasonable to consider, including a subscriber-driven project that could be encouraged by the City in a variety of ways.

The City Council has invited Christensen to come to the June 25th City Council 5 PM business meeting to make a presentation about his ideas. Please come, listen, and ask questions.

Millcreek has four of them: [Canyon Rim Citizens Association](#), [East Mill Creek Community Council](#), [Millcreek Community Council](#), and [Mt. Olympus Community Council](#), comprised in total of around 40 dedicated Millcreek residents. This fall, elections will be held for seats in all of the Councils.

What are Community Councils? The primary purpose of Community Councils is to listen to issues brought to them by citizens and property owners, then formulate

resolutions and make recommendations to the Millcreek Planning Commission and the City Council. Within the boundaries of their individual districts, Community Councils consider land applications, citizen complaints, traffic issues, and whatever other neighborhood issues are brought to their attention. They also participate in Millcreek events such as movie nights, the annual Millcreek luau, the East Mill Creek Lions Club 4th of July celebration, and the summer garden contest.

Community Councils are an invaluable part of municipal life in Millcreek.
