## MILLCREEK GENERAL PLAN

Millcreek Together is a 12-18 month initiative that engages the public in defining a shared vision for the city between now and 2030.

Millcreek is embarking on the exciting process of developing our city's first general plan. This offers an extraordinary platform for city staff, planning commission, community councils, stakeholders, and residents to join in a dialogue focused on enhancing our city's long-term vitality.

The plan, titled Millcreek Together, will define the vision for Millcreek, establish community goals and prioritize steps for achieving those goals. The planning process will help ensure the community's values align with the City's roadmap for development so that Millcreek thrives well

into the future. This plan will guide our approach to preserving, enhancing and growing Millcreek's neighborhoods in a way that promotes mutual prosperity, coordinated public investment and a healthy environment. It will establish a basis for future policies and priorities for development and will provide a balanced, predictable, and flexible land use plan and implementable strategies for economic development, housing, health and well-being, and supporting infrastructure.

Outreach efforts are critical to the goals and objectives for this process. The general plan will

be developed through regular communication with, and input from, the public, and with the technical expertise of the consulting team and City staff. A major focus is to educate the community about the City planning process, why individuals should participate, how the shared vision affects them, and how the City will use the plan to guide the future. *Public Comment Policy and Procedure: The purpose of public comment is to allow citizens to address items on the agenda. Citizens requesting to address the commission may be asked to complete a written comment form and present it to the acting city recorder. In general, the chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.*
