

A capital improvement project (CIP) is one that helps to maintain or improve the City's infrastructure. Each year, the City must perform a financial balancing act to determine what CIPs are the most important to the life of the infrastructure and to the health and safety of residents.

Here are some of the questions that must be answered at the beginning of the fiscal year, and also as the year goes on:

- What are the anticipated costs of the various projects?
- What funds are available at the beginning of the year? Note that annual increases in our public works contract cut into the CIP revenue budget.
- Are any grants available, like from the Wasatch Front Regional Council, or the state's TAP Sidewalk Fund? Grants generally have to be used for specific projects, like improving sidewalks on school routes or painting bike lanes.
- Would UDOT be able and willing to help us move projects ahead of schedule? An example of this is the 39th South project: The federal grant awarded for improvement of that road is not available until 2022, but UDOT has agreed to pay for our currently-engineered project now and then receive and use the 39th South federal grant on UDOT projects that will be ready to go in 2022.
- What plans do adjacent jurisdictions and utilities have in store for the year? Can we coordinate our work to avoid tearing up streets repeatedly?
- What requests have our citizens made? Examples are new sidewalks, traffic calming projects, and streetlights.
- Have costs on CIPs in progress come in higher than anticipated?
- Have emergencies depleted the CIP budget revenue? The biggest and most expensive emergencies that have occurred in the last couple of years involve storm water drains.



John Miller, the City's Public Works Director, has likened our extremely old and dated storm water drainage system to sharks swimming underground all over the City, ready to attack at unexpected and inopportune moments.

The interactive map of Millcreek's current CIPs has 15 projects shown, which range from a \$57,000 sidewalk improvement project on 33rd South to the \$8.65 million 39th South rebuild. The overview of each project describes the problem, how the problem is being fixed, the estimated cost and source of funds, the anticipated completion date, and the project's current status. 
stray pets every year.
