MILLCREEK. It seems like potholes are popping up everywhere. Utah winters are tough on the roads and asphalt for repairs is not available during the winter months. We can fill a problem pothole with a cold patch during the colder months but often these repairs don't hold up for long; maybe a snow plow comes by and just pops the cold patch right back out.

Potholes are expensive. Every time a crew has to be dispatched to fill a pothole, there is a cost. Add them all up and potholes are a significant piece of the City's roads budget. Stretching available funds to address emergency repairs, pavement management plans, and those pesky potholes require a serious budget balancing act.

Each year, the pavement on all roads in the city is assessed and a pavement management program is designed to place overlays, slurry seals or other treatments on roads where the roadway life span can be extended for a few years.

Many of the roads that Millcreek inherited on incorporation were and are in need of repairs. The City works hard to keep up with repairs utilizing available funds, however road repairs often need to be postponed when emergency repairs arise.

The City's main emergencies involve storm drain failures that often cause flooding, and sometimes even road cave-ins. These emergencies have to be addressed immediately and funds have to be shifted from a planned road repair or the pavement management program.

As for potholes, we need your help. All Millcreek employees who are out on roadways keep an eye out for those pesky--and sometimes dangerous--potholes, but we can't catch them all. If you spot one, please let us know. You

can report potholes and other problems by clicking on the button below.

Report a Pothole or Other Concern to Millcreek

If we can't fill the pothole it right away, at least we can put up orange cones to avoid problems.

And speaking of orange cones; there are many places throughout Millcreek that already are sporting them. A lot of these are waterline breaks, which Salt Lake City Public Utilities repairs. Permanent asphalt could not be installed before the winter set in. We are aware of these problem areas and are working diligently with Salt Lake City to have repairs done as soon as possible.

The bottom line: Please report potholes when you see them and please have patience. We are working hard to keep our Millcreek roads safe.

MILLCREEK. Mill Creek Elementary ([3761 S 1100 E](#)), just down the road from City Hall, has a student population of more than 400. Among them, they speak more than 40 different languages. As smart as they are, Principal Ann Kane tells us that food insecurity is a reality at the school, so much so that each child was sent home before this past Christmas break with a box of cereal, which is what the school's budget could afford at the time.

Generosity Feeds, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, in partnership with the Millcreek Promise Program, is fundraising for more, and seeking 200 volunteers for an event that will take place at the school on Saturday, April 18, 2020, 10 am to noon, to help feed these kids.



Join us at Mill Creek Elementary on Saturday, April 18, 2020, 10 am to noon, to help pack 15,000 meals. Generosity Feeds needs a \$1 donation for each meal.

At the April 18th event, volunteers will pack 15,000 meals to send home with the children for weekends, school breaks and holidays. Comprised of black beans, rice, dehydrated vegetables, and protein, these meals were developed by an executive chef to taste good, be a complete nutrition combination, and have a shelf life of one year.

Generosity Feeds is fundraising one dollar for each meal, and needs 200 volunteers on Saturday morning, April 18th, 10 am to noon, to come to the school and help pack these meals. Every dollar helps -- no donation is too large or too small.

Good Ideas for Staying Safe from the Flu, the Common Cold, or the New Coronavirus

MILLCREEK. For the past few weeks, we have been hearing about the Coronavirus (COVID-19) which has been rapidly spreading across the globe. While there are no confirmed cases in Utah, there are still several things we can do to prevent the spread of the virus.

Basic hygiene is essential and is something we can control. Be strict about following these suggestions to prevent transmission:

- [Wash your hands](#) often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. This is especially important when you have been out in public places. Stock your home and workplace with lots of soap.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if you are in a pinch. Carry one in your pocket, purse, car, etc. Buy large bottles of replacement sanitizer.
- Do not touch your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands, this is how the flu and COVID-19 are transmitted.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze in the crook of your elbow.
- Clean and disinfect often-used surfaces and objects, using sprays and wipes designed to kill 99.9% of germs.

2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

This illness can be mild. However, in some cases it is severe enough to require hospitalization. If you have been to mainland China within 14 days and are experiencing these symptoms, seek medical care immediately and tell your healthcare provider about your symptoms and travel.

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To prevent illness:

- Wash your hands often.
- Avoid contact with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose, or eyes.



These are some additional suggestions from the CDC:

- Have enough essentials to shelter-at-home for a few weeks.
- Be financially prepared to sustain a possible temporary interruption to your paycheck while you or a loved one recover from illness.
- Make purchases of essential products as soon as you can, to avoid shortages, unavailability, or unexpected price increases on products.
