


## Online Public Hearing Notice for I-80 Improvements

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## East-West Water Line Project

Salt Lake City's Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) will be constructing a new 6-mile water line from the storage reservoir located at 3300 S and 3500 E down the hill to 300 E and approximately 1700 S. Where this line runs through Millcreek, it will be entirely within Millcreek's right-of-way where SLCDPU, as the provider of water to most of Millcreek, has the right to work to improve water infrastructure.

Phase III, the portion of the project that runs through Millcreek, is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2022. Phase I, which is not in Millcreek, begins this summer. For more information, [click here](#).

## A Pet's License Can Help Get Them Home

Salt Lake County Animal Services

Help your wandering pets get home safely by making sure they're up-to-date on their licenses. Any pet in Salt Lake County can receive a FREE MICROCHIP courtesy of Salt Lake County Animal Services. Make a microchip appointment online at [AdoptUtahPets.org](http://AdoptUtahPets.org) and visit the "services" section.

**When Should You License:** Within 30 days of moving to a new city or as soon as your pet is over 5 months of age.

**Why Your Pet Should Be Licensed:** A license is the best way to reunite you with your pet if they become lost. By keeping your pet information up to date, it makes it easier for staff to identify your pet if they come into the shelter lost. If they go missing, you can send in a recent photo of your pet for us to attach to their license. This way if they do come into the shelter as a stray, we can identify them faster and call you.

**License Fees:** Sterilized pet \$15 (\$5 for senior citizen owners); unsterilized pet \$40.
