


Millcreek Makes Free Internet Access Available to Qualifying Low-Income Residents

Salt Lake County Offers Depression Intervention Program for Teenagers

SALT LAKE COUNTY. While our current circumstances are challenging for most people, many teenagers are particularly impacted. Parents who have a teen who is or who has been depressed may wonder how best to support their teen during this unique crisis.

Salt Lake County Youth Services is offering, ***ME Time***, a six session Cognitive Behavioral Depression Prevention Intervention. It is for teenagers 13-17 years of age who may be experiencing depressive symptoms.

Class #1 focuses on the Triangle of Thoughts, Feelings and Behaviors, analyzing your emotions, identifying negative thoughts, having more fun.

Class #4 focuses on a third way of challenging negative thoughts, negative ruts and getting out of them.

Class #2 focuses on thinking more positively, challenging negative thoughts and rewards.

Class #3 focuses on another way of challenging negative thoughts and contracts.

Class #5 focuses on daily hassles and planning future fun.

Class #6 focuses on major life events, coping with bad feelings and positive emotional toolbox.
