MILLCREEK:*

During the lead-up to Thanksgiving during the next 10 or 12 days, and in light of Governor Herbert's executive order this past Monday, I am

pleading with you all to observe a pause in your activities -- work from home where possible, visit with household members only, and limit your outside contacts to those that are only absolutely necessary.

Since the first of November, more than 31,500 Utahns have tested positive for the COVID-19 virus -- that's equivalent to half the population of Millcreek. Almost 4,000 of those cases were diagnosed *just yesterday*. Hospitals are being overrun and out-of-state medical personnel are being imported to give relief to our exhausted health care workers. It's frightening to imagine what next week will bring if we continue on this course. A pause in our activities would help break the virus's hold on our community.

The City will be implementing strict measures at City Hall through November 25th to reduce contact and gatherings for non-household groups. City Hall will be open by appointment only, except for public meetings and public hearings, and in those cases attendance will be limited to 10 people, masks must be worn at all times, and social distancing will be enforced. You can find these measures in [Emergency Directive No. 6](#), issued earlier this week.

The City's public Wi-Fi will be restricted to outdoor use only. Residents may remain in their vehicles outside City Hall and still access the public Wi-Fi. Staff will be working remotely to the extent possible, and will be available by appointment only, which will primarily be conducted virtually or via phone. Walk-ins are discouraged unless previously coordinated with staff. Staff phone numbers may be found by clicking on the appropriate department pages at millcreek.us, or residents may call [801-214-2700](tel:801-214-2700) to set up an

appointment. Note that staff members are authorized to lock the doors to City Hall during business hours if necessary to reduce the number of people entering the building.

While we dislike having to restrict access to City Hall in any way, we know that this two-week pause on social contacts outside of household members is best to protect you and our staff and to bring the COVID-19 counts down in our City. Be assured that City Hall remains fully operational and we will always have staff available during business hours to assist you, virtually whenever possible.

These are trying times. We are grateful for the patience demonstrated by our residents. Let's take a pause for the next couple of weeks. We should be able to slow the spread of this deadly virus and start down the path of returning to normalcy.

Community councils serve a vital role in Millcreek. They are the grassroots connection to the City Council regarding planning/zoning, and capital improvement projects. They regularly report the needs and concerns of residents to the attention of the council.

Salt Lake County Animal Services has relaunched and expanded its Book Buddies program virtually. This is the perfect volunteer opportunity for children and a way to sooth a shelter pet.

Children sign up to read to a shelter pet from their home. The program helps them improve their reading skills while helping shelter animals with socialization. Dogs and cats find the rhythmic sounds of a voice very soothing. This is for beginning level readers and up.

Book Buddies has been a volunteer program for children at Salt Lake County Animal Services since 2016. The program has been adjusted to give children an opportunity to interact with pets at the shelter during COVID-19.

How Book Buddies Works:

- Parents sign their child up for a 10-minute reading session at bit.ly/slco_bookbuddies
- Upon registration, the participant will receive an email with a Zoom link for the upcoming session. Parents, please help your child log into the meeting a few minutes before their scheduled time.

Virtual Book Buddies is offered twice a week: Mondays: 3:30 - 5 PM and Fridays: 2 - 3:30 PM
