MILLCREEK'S 2ND POLICING TOWN HALL BOOKENDS FORMAL PUBLIC MEETINGS

MILLCREEK. The City's second Policing Town Hall took place this past Tuesday. A panel of "experts" was able to answer many of the questions Millcreek citizens have raised since the unrest that took place last summer after the death of George Floyd.

The mostly-virtual meeting was held by City Council members, Mayor Silvestrini, and members of the public, together with leadership from the Unified Police Department, including

Sheriff Rosie Rivera, Chief of Police Jason Mazaran, Undersheriff Jake Peterson, Millcreek Precinct Chief Steve DeBry and Millcreek Lieutenant Chris Petty-Brown.

The UPD leaders and Mayor Silvestrini, who sits on the UPD's Board of Trustees, were able to answer questions and concerns raised by residents, such as:

- Are our non-violent crimes going unsolved?
- What constitutes a "crime"?
- What situations warrant calling the police?
- What is the definition of "resisting arrest"?
- How is the UPD organized? Who are the leaders?
- How is UPD's budget set?
- What the F.O.P. ?
- How does the UPD recruit?
- Does the Millcreek Precinct of the UPD have any officers from the refugee community?
- How does the UPD set policy and can members of the community ask for changes?
- Could a George Floyd-type incident occur if officers were following UPD policy, training and procedure?
- Does de-escalation training occur and at what frequency?

Tuesday's Town Hall was the last of a series of events since last summer, that included the City's first Town Hall in August, monthly meetings with a group of volunteers and residents led by City Councilmember Bev Uipi, and a field visit training that the UPD led with a dozen citizens in October. The field visit included a workshops on the UPD's budgeting and training, and a simulation of real-life situations that police officers face on a daily basis.

The purposes of the town halls, the meetings, and the field visit were to

respond to the community's concerns raised after the tragic death of George Floyd and to improve relationships between the community and the UPD.

While it appears that Millcreek and the UPD have been doing things right, citizens are invited to continue to engage with the City and with UPD with questions and concerns. The Council will address issues as they arise and intends to keep the citizen working group informed and involved. A town hall will be scheduled for January 2022 to talk about progress and changes if needed.

Many thanks to the UPD leaders, Councilwoman Bev Uipi, and the volunteer citizens group that have all worked diligently over the last several months on these issues.

HOW IS COVID IMPACTING MILLCREEK?

Case Counts through yesterday (1/14/21)*:

Millcreek (surrounding cities) cumulative and current cases by zip code:

84106: 2,752 total cases (277 current cases)
84107: 3,517 total cases (317 current cases)
84109: 2,018 total cases (231 current cases)
84117: 2,142 total cases (241 current cases)
84123: 3,806 total cases (334 current cases)
84124: 1,801 total cases (208 current cases)

TOTAL: 16,036 (increase of 801 since 1/7/21, our last reported data.)

.Vaccines: Teachers, school staff, and health care workers throughout the state have been receiving vaccinations this week. About 30,000 Salt Lake County residents ages 70 and older have been able to register for the available vaccine appointments that start next week. Salt Lake County suggests checking back weekly to determine appointment availability. [Here is the scheduling link.](#)

Patience is cautioned, as appointments are in greater demand than the currently available vaccine. The state assures Utahns all that everyone who wants the vaccine will eventually get one.

2021 Pet Resolutions

A Message from Salt Lake County Animal Services:

Did you get a pet this holiday season? Or did you forget to vaccinate or license your pet in 2020? At Salt Lake County Animal Services, we recommend getting these services done to ensure your pet is healthy and ready to get going for the New Year.

- **VACCINATE:** Make sure they are up to date on vaccinations. Pet illnesses and diseases are preventable if you vaccinate your pet. Veterinary visits are booked out far in advance at this time, so call and make an appointment right away.
- **MICROCHIP:** *At Salt Lake County Animal Services, on the 2nd Thursday of the month from 2 PM- 4 PM, there are DRIVE-UP, microchipping and licensing clinics, at 511 W 3900 S. Any pet in Salt Lake County with a current pet license can receive a FREE microchip with proof of license. Microchipping is one of the best ways to get an animal back to their owner as quick as possible. Questions? Email animal@slco.org.*
- **LICENSE:** *By Utah state law, pet owners must license a pet by the time they are five months of age or within 30 days of moving into an area or acquiring the pet. Find out more about licensing on our website. Or call to make an appointment at [385-468-7387](tel:385-468-7387). The shelter is open Mon-Sat, 10 AM-6PM.
