### **MILLCREEK DESIGNATED A HEALTHY UTAH COMMUNITY**

MILLCREEK. Millcreek is proud to have been recognized by the non-profit organization *Get Healthy Utah* and the *Utah League of Cities and Towns* (ULCT) as a "Healthy Utah Community." The award was presented to Millcreek, along with ten other Utah cities and towns, on the final day of the ULCT April 2021 Conference.

In the spirit of connecting to nature, Millcreek has implemented several strategies to promote health equity and outdoor recreation within our borders.

Shortly after incorporation, the City initiated the Millcreek Promise Program. A collaboration with United Way of Salt Lake and volunteers throughout the city, the program supports the success of Millcreek youth and families by making specific promises to improve the education, health and safe, and economic well-being of all Millcreek residents.

The Promise Health & Safety Subcommittee promotes food equity and an active lifestyle. Sunnyvale Park, located at 4013 South 700 West, sits in a neighborhood populated by many immigrant and refugee families. This small park has become the focus of improvements intended to promote a healthy lifestyle for surrounding residents.



*Raised garden beds at Sunnyvale Park were installed in conjunction with Millcreek's Promise Program to help surrounding residents grow culturally unique produce.*

Community garden boxes are being utilized in coordination with the IRC New Roots program. They provide a place where fresh and culturally unique produce can be grown. New futsal courts installed this past July are being enjoyed by numerous children that live in this area.

At Mill Creek Elementary, a food pantry was established during the pandemic to help struggling families in need of groceries. This augmented the food pantries at Moss Elementary and at Olympus High School, both programs that our Millcreek Youth Council supports.

Plans are being developed in coordination with Salt Lake County and the Forest Service to provide transportation improvements in Millcreek Canyon and expanded parking at the Neff's Canyon trailhead. Parking has also been expanded at the Grandeur Peak trailhead to allow residents to access the many trails located along our eastern border.



*Millcreek is bordered by the beautiful Wasatch Mountains to the east and the Jordan River to the west, allowing plentiful opportunities for outdoor recreation right at our doorstep.*

Work is underway to acquire property along the Jordan River in order to build an extension of the Jordan River Parkway along Millcreek's border with the Jordan River. Property along the foothills above Mt. Olympus has been purchased to be preserved as open space.

Millcreek's designation as a Healthy Utah Community is a great opportunity to showcase the work Millcreek is doing to support healthy living for all residents. ## MILLCREEK ROAD CONSTRUCTION ALERTS

- **700 East from Empire to Red Maple** - Sidewalk Installation underway
- **1300 East from Elgin to Miller** - Utility work underway, 1300 E will be partially closed
- **3900 South from 700 East to 700 West** - Road overlay work, partial road closures
- **3900 South from Wasatch Blvd to 2300 East** - Ongoing roadway improvements, partial road closures

## CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

### Utility Work on 700 East

UDOT is installing fiber optic conduit and cable along the east side of 700 E through Millcreek as part of their Advanced Traffic Management System. The

project begins at the city boundary with Murray (4500 S) and continues north to the Salt Lake City limits (~2750 S).

Daytime construction will occur and there will be daily lane closures. Please be careful driving or walking in the area and follow posted pedestrian detour routes.

## How To Greet A Dog

*Prevent Dog Bites From Happening*

MILLCREEK. Warm weather is quickly approaching, as are gatherings with people and pets at parks, homes, and other locations. Salt Lake County Animal Services, which provides animal services throughout Millcreek, has some suggestions on how to greet a dog safely, whether it's a dog you're familiar with or one you're meeting for the first time. Animal Services encourages these steps to help your dog from being put in an uncomfortable situation with strangers, or even friends and family.

**When you're approaching a dog that you would like to pet but**

**Step 5:** If you have permission, do a quick body language check again.

**don't know:**

**Step 1:** Make sure the dog has a leash, a collar, and an owner. If it doesn't, call Animal Control.

**Step 2:** Look at the dog's body language. Look to see if it is a happy/relaxed dog. There are many online resources that demonstrate dog body language.

**Step 3:** Ask permission from the Owner: "May I please pet your dog?" It is okay if the owner says no!

**Step 4:** Keep hands to yourself until the dog approaches you, seeking out interaction.

Common mistakes:

- Putting your hand up to a dog's nose. Dogs do not need to smell your hand.

- Leaning over the dog or put your face into the dog's face

**Step 6:** Angle body slightly away from dog.

**Step 7:** Pet the dog calmly and quietly, avoiding sensitive areas.

**Step 8:** Remain standing if it is a large or medium sized dog. If it is a small dog, you can crouch down, making sure you are still not leaning over the dog.

- 84124: 2,210 total cases (25 current cases)
