

MILLCREEK. The Utah Department of Transportation will improve I-80 between 1300 East and 2300 East and I-215 between 3300 South and 4500 South. Construction will start as early as mid-May and continue through late 2022.

WFWRD has launched a free mobile app for its residents. It can be found by searching for “Wasatch Front Waste” on the Apple or Android app stores, and it is available in both English and Spanish. The app includes a “Recycle Right” lookup tool to find out if a material can be reused, recycled, composted or landfilled.



It also provides a scheduling tool for residents to confirm their collection day, and it provides an option for customized reminders for pick-up days.

The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
