Be Water-Aware In More Ways Than One

MILLCREEK. We all know that this was a dry winter. The amount of water in the snow accumulations is well below average. We live in a desert and all of us need to be water aware.

As the weather is heating up, more residents are starting up their sprinkler systems and we need be aware of the need for water conservation.

The [Utah Division of Water Resources](#) is saying that for the next week, we should run our sprinklers only twice. You can follow this reliable [Weekly Lawn Watering Guide](#) designed exclusively for Salt Lake County to help you determine when and how much to water. The normal rule of thumb is that one irrigation equals 20 minutes with pop-up spray heads and 40 minutes with impact rotor sprinklers.

This year, however, is not a normal year and a little bit of water conservation by everyone can make a difference. Try reducing your sprinkler time settings by 10% by watering your lawn for 18 minutes instead of 20 or cutting one day out of your watering schedule when it starts to get hot, and your lawn needs more water. The state watering experts estimate that Utah could save more than 20 billion gallons of water in the summer if everyone watered according to the [Weekly Lawn Watering Guide](#).

Please stay out of the streams during the spring runoff.

A little wading can rapidly turn into an emergency.

Carefully watch your kids and your doggie family members and keep them safe.



Oddly enough, while we are talking about the low snowpack and the need for conserving water, we need to be **water aware** on another front as well. The snowpack is melting and the runoff is expected to peak during the end of May.

This means that we all need to be aware of fast running streams. The runoff is fast and cold and it doesn't take very deep water to knock a child or even adult off their feet.



900 East Improvements to Begin Another Major Road Project to Watch for in 2021

MILLCREEK. Grant funding was acquired in 2019 to improve 900 East between 3900 S and 4500 S. Design is currently underway. An open house was held earlier this week to present the current plan to the public. Property owners along the corridor have been individually contacted and negotiations are underway to discuss any impact to each individual property.



MILLCREEK. Construction on UDOT's I-80 & I-215 Renewal project will begin next week. UDOT is improving I-80 between 1300 E and 2300 E and I-215 between 3300 S and 4500 S. Drivers should expect lane closures primarily overnight and on the weekends. Drivers are advised to use caution in the work zone.
