MILLCREEK. Anyone who travels along Highland Drive will have noticed some changes in the past couple of weeks. Both north and south-bound traffic lanes have been reconfigured to improve safety, encourage slower speeds and allow for a better interface between residents and businesses in the area.

The new configuration from four traffic lanes to two traffic lanes with a center turn lane will match the reconfigured lanes Salt Lake City has painted from the north side of our boundary to the intersection with 1300 East.

The City has been discussing the possibility of this change for several months. First, [a traffic study was completed in November 2019](#), which indicated that the restriping would improve safety for drivers, pedestrians and cyclists.

Then, an Open House for the public was held on February 12, 2020 to discuss the potential reconfiguration. Concerns about traffic speeding along the street in excess of the 35 mph limit were expressed, as well as the difficulty drivers were having accessing businesses. With the old striping, drivers in the left lane would have to stop in the middle of traffic to turn into a business, which would cause a backup of several cars and sometimes even rear end collisions. The new striping, which includes a center turn, lane will help to alleviate those problems.

Although past traffic studies showed that this new configuration would result in Highland Drive being a better, safer street, this new re-striping configuration is only paint. Future traffic studies will be conducted and if they show that the

new configuration is not working as planned, re-painting can take place.

We understand that it will take a while to get used to the new lanes and ask for your patience as drivers make the adjustment to the new traffic pattern. Please adhere to the 35 mph speed limit, stay safe and take the time to visit some of our local businesses on Highland Drive.

BE AWARE OF NEW STATE FIRE RESTRICTIONS AMIDST UTAH'S HISTORIC DROUGHT

STATE OF UTAH. Anyone who has stepped outside lately knows it's very hot and very dry--prime conditions for a wildfire. Because of these conditions, the Utah Department of Natural Resources (DNR) is temporarily banning campfires and recreational target shooting statewide in all Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs), effective immediately. Governor Cox has also placed a statewide ban on fireworks on all state and unincorporated private lands. These steps are being taken to reduce the risk of man-made wildfires amidst a historic drought.

As you are making summer plans, whether you plan to camp in our beautiful Wasatch Range or light fireworks for 4th of July festivities, please remember to adhere to these rules so that we can all continue to enjoy the natural beauty around us.

Per the DWR's Fire Restriction Order, the following mandates are in effect on all state lands and all unincorporated private lands in Utah:

1. **NO OPEN FIRES** of any kind except within established facilities in improved campgrounds or day-use areas on public land --OR-- in permanently constructed fire pits at permanent private dwellings served by pressurized running water.
2. **NO SMOKING**, except within an enclosed vehicle, trailer or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area that is paved or free from dry vegetation
3. **NO CUTTING, WELDING, OR GRINDING METAL** in areas of dry vegetation
4. **NO OPERATING ANY SMALL INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE**, like on motorcycles, chainsaws, ATVs, etc., without an approved and working spark arrestor

Violating any of the above mandates is a criminal act, and is punishable under state law by up to six months in jail and a fine of up to \$1,000. These restriction will be enforced by county law enforcement.


