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## Rapid COVID Testing Available for Travelers

Travelers who need to be tested before leaving Utah can now get a PCR, rapid PCR, and rapid antigen test at several locations. The closest location for Millcreek residents is:

### Mount Olympus Senior Center (1634 E Murray Holladay Rd)

- Drive-thru in northeast parking lot
- Monday-Friday, 7 AM - 2 PM
- Saturday 7 AM - 3 PM

PCR results are usually available within 24-48 hours; rapid PCR and rapid antigen results are usually available within 30-60 minutes. It is the traveler's responsibility to know which type of test is required for their destination. For information on travel requirements by destination, visit the [CDC's website](#).

Traveler testing is free for Utah residents with proof of residency (state-issued identification, utility statement, credit card statement, tax notice, etc.). Travelers must also show proof of travel, such as a boarding pass or other travel documents.
