


The last day to vote is November 2nd!!

FULL ROAD CLOSURE NOTICE **3900 SOUTH, FROM 2300 TO 2700 EAST**


MILLCREEK. Beginning on **Sunday, Oct. 24**, drivers should expect a full closure of 3900 South from 2700 East to 2300 East (Segment 3). **This closure could last up to four weeks while crews complete paving activities before winter.** Segment 3 will remain accessible to local traffic only, including those accessing Buttons 'N Bows Preschool and Our Saviour's Lutheran Church. Commuters will be detoured to Lincoln Lane. *See the map above for the detour route.*

During this closure, crews will remove the old asphalt, prepare the ground and pave both sides of the road simultaneously. Weekend work is possible but is weather- and schedule-dependent. Residents should drive slowly through the closed roadway section and expect uneven driving surfaces.

The 2700 East and 2300 East intersections will remain open during this closure. However, the 2700 East intersection will have impacts and/or closures for a handful of days as part of the road reconstruction.

Paving schedules are dependent on weather and materials and subject to change.

Rapid COVID Testing Available for Travelers

Travelers who need to be tested before leaving Utah can now get a PCR, rapid PCR, and rapid antigen test at several locations. The closest location for Millcreek residents is:

Mount Olympus Senior Center (1634 E Murray Holladay Rd)

- Drive-thru in northeast parking lot
- Monday-Friday, 7 AM - 2 PM
- Saturday 7 AM - 3 PM

PCR results are usually available within 24-48 hours; rapid PCR and rapid antigen results are usually available within 30-60 minutes. It is the traveler's responsibility to know which type of test is required for their destination. For information on travel requirements by destination,

visit the [CDC's website](#).

Traveler testing is free for Utah residents with proof of residency (state-issued identification, utility statement, credit card statement, tax notice, etc.). Travelers must also show proof of travel, such as a boarding pass or other travel documents.

At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
