### **3900 SOUTH IMPROVEMENTS ALMOST COMPLETED**

Improvement Project is nearing completion. A ribbon cutting will take place on Wednesday, Nov. 24th, at 1pm, on 3900 South just east of the intersection with 2300 East, Mayor Silvestrini will be joined by Mayor Dahle of Holladay to cut the celebratory ribbon and officially open the street. The public is invited.



The 3900 South construction project has been a partnership between Millcreek and Holladay City, each of which owns half of the street. Construction has taken longer than anticipated, as utility infrastructure improvements by third parties did not allowing our contractor to get started until early in 2021. Working through additional problems related to COVID and the supply chain disruption, our contractor has done an admirable job of getting us to the point of having a new roadway ready this fall.

Additional work will need to be done along the stretch, some of which may extend into spring 2022, but the road itself has been completely redone -- right down to the road base -- to provide a brand new street that will last for years to come.


The best part: the entire \$8.65 million project was paid for through grant funding, with no direct financial burden to Millcreek or Holladay taxpayers.

## **SALT LAKE COUNTY AGING & ADULT SERVICES SEEKS DONORS TO HELP SPREAD HOLIDAY CHEER**

## **Vaccines Now Available for Children 5+**

The Pfizer vaccine is now available for children ages 5-11. Vaccination remains our best tool to fight this pandemic and protect yourself and those around you. The Salt Lake County Health Department is offering these vaccinations at several elementary schools this weekend. No appointment is necessary, although your wait for service may be longer without one.

In addition to the clinics this weekend, there will be several vaccination clinics available to those 5 years and older at elementary schools in or near Millcreek:

- Thursday, November 18 - Moss Elementary, 3-7 PM
- Tuesday, November 23, Oakwood Elementary, 3-7 PM
- Wednesday, November 24, Eastwood Elementary, 3-7 PM

The Small Business Employee Vaccination Grant has received \$500,000 in federal CARES Act funds as part of Utah's response to the coronavirus pandemic. It provides reimbursement to Utah small business employers that pay employees for time off to either receive a COVID-19 vaccine or recuperate should they experience side effects after their vaccination.

The grant offers employers funds to provide paid time off for employees who are otherwise not eligible for paid time off. The grant may be used for both full-time and part-time employees to:

- Receive a COVID-19 vaccine
- Recuperate after receiving the vaccination
- Take a dependent child (5-18 years old) to receive the vaccine, or
- Be the caregiver for a dependent child (5-18 years old) who needs assistance to recuperate after receiving a COVID-19 vaccine.

Grants will be offered to employers until December 31, 2021, or the \$500,000 grant funds are encumbered.
