I-80 & I-215

RENEWED

PROJECT PROGRESS

Construction on the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) I-80 & I-215 Renewed project began in May 2021. Crews made steady progress through the project's first construction season. Year one included reconstructing the medians of I-80 and I-215,

building the new 1700 East bridge over I-80, constructing portions of two temporary bridges, and starting to reconstruct six ramps on I-80 and I-215.



WHAT'S NEXT?

- Demolition and replacement of the existing 1700 East bridge over I-80
- Sliding the new 1700 East bridge into place
- Reconstruction of one shoulder and three I-80 travel lanes between 1300 East and 2300 East
- Reconstruction of one shoulder and two I-215 travel lanes between 3300 South and 4500 South
- Demolition and replacement of the existing 1300 East bridge over I-80
- Sliding the new 1300 East bridge into place
- Reconstruction of four ramps on I-80 and I-215
- Recycling 25,000 cubic yards of existing concrete pavement for use in the new roadway sections

The Utah Broadband Center, powered by the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity, is launching the Utah Internet Speed Test Campaign.

This is a statewide effort for Utahns to report their internet speed at home, work, or wherever they connect to broadband. **People with or without internet access are encouraged to participate.**

The Speed Test Campaign will help:

- Reveal areas of Utah that lack high-speed internet connection to homes and businesses
- Direct funding to provide reliable broadband access throughout the state
- Discover which households do not have an internet connection and the reasons

Case counts through 3/3/2022

Millcreek (surrounding cities) cumulative and current cases by zip code:

- 84106: 8,174 total cases (64 current cases)
- 84107: 9,581 total cases (43 current cases)
- 84109: 5,740 total cases (57 current cases)
- 84117: 6,003 total cases (63 current cases)
- 84123: 10,217 total cases (63 current cases)
- 84124: 5,081 total cases (41 current cases)

TOTAL: **44,796** (increase of 195 since 2/24/2022, our last reported data). Not a lot of reported testing is going on at this point, so the numbers are not very meaningful. This will be our last report. You can check with the County [HERE](#) if you want to know their latest data.
