MILLCREEK COUNCIL TO APPOINT HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

MILLCREEK. Millcreek is establishing an Historic Preservation Commission for the City. The Commission will have a number of important roles, including documenting and celebrating our histories, identifying and registering sites on the National Register of Historic Sites, advising the community on the protection of cultural resources,

and working with the State Historic Preservation
Office to preserve historic sites.

The creation of an Historic Preservation Commission is the first step in making Millcreek a Certified Local Government, which makes us eligible to apply for federal grants for historic preservation, and will make available other incentives and tax benefits to promote the preservation of historic buildings and sites.

In response to invitations made over the past several months through social media, at council meetings, and on the website, we received many more applications than we have seats on the Commission. As a community, we are fortunate there are so many residents with a passion for Millcreek's culture and history.

On Monday, the City Council will consider the appointment of seven Millcreek residents to our new Historic Preservation Commission. Representative of each City Council District, the nominees are residents Andrea Maxfield, Emily Johnson, Molly Enos, Tiffany Hunter Greene, Ryan Lufkin, Kaye Donahoe, and Peter Brinton. Among these talented volunteers are an historian, an architect, a curator, a museum manager, and an environmental engineer. Together they will provide, as our ordinance requires, "a balanced representation in terms of geographic, professional, neighborhood, and community interests."

The Historic Preservation Commission's first tasks will include engaging in a series of trainings, setting goals and objectives for the next few years, and establishing a schedule for public meetings.



Millcreek Residents Spotlighted for their Recycling Efforts

MILLCREEK. Millcreek was the Spotlight in the Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District April 2022 Community Newsletter, which complimented our residents for doing a great job of recycling. Millcreek's contamination rate this quarter was 18.87%, in comparison to the entire District's contamination rate of 27.04%.

What is recycling contamination? Every day the WFWRD trucks collect recyclables and drop them off at a local sorting facility. However, nearly 20% of the material in the blue recycling bins is trash, like garbage bags, packaging plastics, wire and food. This contamination can jamming the sorting machines and cause huge delays. Food or liquid can contaminate otherwise clean materials, causing them to no longer be recyclable, rendering them trash.

While the contamination rate has improved greatly, there are still areas of improvement. The largest contaminant in Millcreek is plastic packaging materials, like bubble wrap, Styrofoam, padded envelopes and plastic wrap. Please keep those items out of your blue cans.

All plastic bags (grocery or garbage bags), plastic packaging and flimsy plastics can be recycled but NOT in the blue curbside recycling can. If it is plastic and you can ball it up in your fist, it is garbage if placed in the blue can. Many local grocery stores provide a plastic collection bin near the entrance of the building. Drop your plastics in one of these bins and the materials are then taken to the

[Renewlogy Plant](#) to be recycled.

Keep up the good work Millcreek!


Check out this time-lapse video of the construction happening at the new City Hall and Millcreek Common



MILLCREEK. We had a very successful vaccination clinic on April 5th, with 45 residents getting their fourth COVID-19 shot. If you missed that opportunity, you have another chance next Friday, April 29th. Many thanks to Salt Lake County for providing Millcreek residents an easy way to keep up on their vaccinations.

You are welcome to come in for your first shot. Here are the categories of folks who qualify for boosters:

- People ages 12 years and older who are moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a second booster dose using an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine at least 4 months after the first booster dose.
- Adults ages 50 years and older who are **not** moderately or severely immunocompromised may choose to receive a second booster dose using an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine at least 4 months after the first booster dose.
- People ages 18–49 years who are **not** moderately or severely immunocompromised and who received Janssen COVID-19 Vaccine as both their primary series dose and booster dose may receive a second booster dose using an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine at least 4 months after the first Janssen booster dose.



In general, the Chair will allow an individual two minutes to address the Council. A spokesperson, recognized as representing a group in attendance, may be allowed up to five minutes. At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
