CITY RECEIVES \$200,000 GRANT FOR CLIMBING WALL

MILLCREEK. Earlier this week, Millcreek was awarded a \$200,000 Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant for the climbing wall that will be built on the northeast corner of the new city hall that is currently under construction. "The Utah Office of Outdoor Recreation and the Division of Recreation are proud to support your outdoor recreation infrastructure project," said Patrick

Morrison, with the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity. "Thank you for making Utah the greatest state for amazing outdoor recreation!"

Millcreek City Hall will boast the tallest outdoor climbing wall in the state once it is completed. Currently being designed by local firm Vertical Solutions, the wall will soar 81 vertical feet on its north and east sides, with the south side envisioned as a 55-foot high Olympic-standard speed climbing wall. The state grant will cover about half of the construction costs. The city will put out for bid the opportunity for a climbing gym or company to operate the climbing wall.

"Millcreek is proving to be a true inspiration for the climbing community," said USA Climbing CEO Marc Norman, who attended the recent groundbreaking of City Hall. "This amazing facility smartly complements Millcreek's access to the world-class climbing opportunities in our neighboring canyons," he said. USA Climbing is the national governing body of the sport of competition climbing in the United States; it recently moved from Boulder, Colorado to Salt Lake. They are optimistic about our area helping to train future Olympians.



"Our city motto is connected by nature, and the excitement on the climbing wall will enhance the activity on the Skate Loop on adjacent Millcreek Common," said City Councilwoman Cheri Jackson. "Both of these outdoor recreation amenities for Millcreek have been largely funded by state grants our team has been able to procure," she said.

Previously, the city was awarded \$500,000 for the construction of Millcreek Common's Skate Loop. At 11,000 square feet, the Skate Loop is now the largest outdoor skating facility in Utah. Roller skating will open soon, and this winter it will transform to ice skating. The climbing wall is anticipated to open with City Hall in the fall of 2023.


During the ramp closures, drivers can access westbound I-80 from the on-ramp at 1300 East. See the map above.
