Be Safe and the Serious When You Get Behind the Wheel #slowdowninyourtown

MILLCREEK. Summer can be a dangerous time

school and families are taking road trips.

Across Utah in 2021, there were 8,106 speed related crashes. There were 89 fatal speed related crashes and 106 speed related fatalities. Thirty percent of all fatal crashes were speed related. The summer of 2021 was one of the deadliest summers in Utah's history due to fatal car accidents.

Please remember that there is a reason for speed limits. Roadways are to be driven with caution and the speed limits are designed to protect everyone — drivers, passengers, bicyclists, and pedestrians. A speed related accident is always serious and often life-changing, the higher the speed the greater amount of energy that must be absorbed in a crash with more likelihood of severe injury or death.

This summer we have already seen a significant increase in traffic speeds. Law enforcement and the mayors of Salt Lake County are asking everyone to slow down, give yourself extra time to get where you need to be. Millcreek has joined with the other cities, metro townships and law enforcement agencies across the county to promote a traffic safety initiative, **#slowdowninyourtown**, to ask our residents to slow down.

This summer we want all Millcreek residents to stay safe on the roads. It is better to arrive late than never. Be cautioned that law enforcement will be heavily enforcing traffic and speed laws this summer, so save yourself a ticket as well.




The Best Small Cities to Start a Small Business: 2022 Report

A Message from Salt Lake County Animal Services

More pets go missing in the summer months than any other time of year. Make sure they always have on a collar with an ID tag, with up-to-date info. Watch out for these sounds of summer.

Barbecues: If guests are going to be coming in and out of the front door or back gate,

keep your pets in a secure area, or put them in their crate, if. An unsecured gate, or door left open, is the perfect opportunity for your pet to take themselves on an adventure without you.

Thunderstorms: According to the ASPCA, 1 in 5 pets goes missing after being scared by loud noises. Be sure to bring your pet indoors and keep them away from open windows when summer storms roll into your area.

Fireworks: The loud noise of firework displays, big or small, are scary and disorienting to pets. Leave them at home, inside with a loud fan, or calming music. If the fireworks display is in your driveway, be sure to clean up the leftover firework debris, never underestimate what your dog may stick in its mouth. Fireworks are poisonous to pets.

All pets in Salt Lake County can receive a free microchip at Salt Lake County Animal Services, pet licensing may be required depending on your city. Email animal@slco.org or come to Animal Services at 511 W 3900 S, Tue – Fri, 10-6 to get your pet microchipped.

Find a lost pet? Contact your local animal control! The first-place pet owners look for a lost pet is the local shelter. All pets at Salt Lake County Animal Services can be seen online at AdoptUtahPets.org.



Protect Yourself from Mosquitoes

A Message from the Salt Lake County Health Department

There's nothing better than beating the summer heat with water — from pool parties to boating. But do you know who else likes water? Mosquitos.

Standing water is the perfect place for mosquitos to lay eggs and gather. It's their version of a pool party. So it's time to crash the party or drain it...

Stop mosquitoes from laying eggs in or near water. Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, or trash containers. Check for water-holding containers both indoors and outdoors.

Protect yourself and others this summer from the West Nile Virus and enjoy the sunshine bug-bite-free.
