The City Council has adopted the same fireworks restrictions map (shown above) as was in place last year. This map was developed in coordination with the Unified Fire Authority, and

considers areas of high fire danger.

Utah law allows for personal fireworks to be launched July 2-5 and July 22-25 from 11am to 11pm. The hours are extended on the Fourth of July and Pioneer Day holidays to midnight.

Last year there were not many complaints of violations in the restricted areas or time frames. We thank everyone who paid attention and did the right thing.

Please do the right thing again this year. We are in the grip of an historic drought and even though many lawns are looking very brown and dry, it seems that the weeds are flourishing. A spark from a firework, even from something as small as a sparkler, can easily set off a very dangerous fire. If you are planning on celebrating in areas where fireworks are not restricted, please remember to keep a bucket of water handy and douse and clean up all your debris. Remember, it is illegal to trespass onto a business parking lot to set off fireworks without the permission of the property owner.

Specific types of fireworks are prohibited in Utah. Please purchase your fireworks at local stands or stores and use only approved varieties.

Anyone setting off fireworks outside of the allowed times or in restricted areas (including on private property) is subject to a \$1,000 fine and also are subject to the damages and control costs of fighting a fire.

No one wants to be the cause of a fire at their or their neighbor's house or field. Please celebrate safely and follow the rules. Have a safe fireworks season!



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## Zoning and Subdivision Code Update

Millcreek has begun the process of updating its Zoning and Subdivision Codes. These codes are the primary tools the city uses to help shape development. This includes everything from what land uses are allowed in which areas to how many parking spaces are needed. Much of the existing code was inherited from Salt Lake County when the city incorporated. While updates have been made to portions of the code since then, this update is aimed at looking at them in their entirety.

To begin the process, the city contracted with Logan Simpson to help draft the code update. Currently they are in the process of interviewing stakeholders such as residents, developers, and city staff. These interviews will help evaluate the current code to see what changes may be needed and the findings will be summarized in an analysis of the existing code.
