- Safe to be in the water? Absolutely. The splash pad water is treated and tested regularly.
- Costly? A splash pad uses much less water and costs less than any of the other park amenities the city provides for the benefit of our residents.

The water for the splash pad is really a minimal expense and it has created much joy in the children of the city who have experienced it. In these times of drought and extreme heat, the splash pad and municipal parks provide a much needed refuge and the opportunity to cool down and enjoy the joys of the outdoors without traveling far from home.

The splash pad and Millcreek Common were built with a bond which will be repaid over time—not by regular taxpayers, but by the owners of the redevelopment projects being built in the City Center area.

If you haven't already, take some time to visit the Common, watch the kids enjoying the splash pad (or get wet yourself) and marvel at the skills of the roller skaters on the Loop. Don't forget to top it off with some fantastic ice cream from the Normal Ice Cream Truck. This area is becoming the City Center that residents told us that they wanted to see during the master planning efforts shortly after incorporation. Watch as in the winter the Loop transforms to ice skating with fire pits to warm yourself.

The currently proposed property tax increase will only impact the "Millcreek City" line (highlighted in yellow, above) on your property tax notice. A 5% increase would cost this taxpayer \$21.15 per year. The full amount in this line item pays for Unified Police Department.



## Maintenance Work is Coming to Lower Millcreek Canyon

This August the Greater Salt Lake Municipal Services District and Unincorporated Salt Lake County will begin conducting work to extend the life of the pavement in Millcreek Canyon. This project will mill off the top layer of asphalt and add fresh pavement and

update signing and striping of the roadway. Additionally, some key area drainage improvements will also be included in this project.



**WORK ACTIVITIES:** Construction activities will begin Monday, August 8th, and will wrap up in fall 2022. Crews will be onsite daily from approximately 8 am to 5 pm. In order to complete the improvements to the roadway, lane closures will be in place during this work.

### **CANYON USERS - PLEASE PLAN AHEAD**

**Road Cycling Closures.** Because this work will remove the top lay of asphalt, it will not be safe for cyclists to use the road until construction is complete. The road will be closed below the winter gate to all bicycle traffic throughout the duration of this project. For your safety and the safety of the crews, please do not attempt to pass through the construction area on your bike.

**Other Impacts During Construction.** One lane of traffic will remain open throughout construction and will be fully reopened to traffic on weekends. Please plan for extra time when driving up the canyon. Driveway access will remain open except for very brief interruptions while work passes directly in front of each access.

### **OTHER AREA PROJECTS:**

**Salt Lake County Upper Millcreek Canyon Road Improvements Project.** This project is separate from the maintenance on the Millcreek Canyon road section from the Winter Gate to the Big Water Trailhead. That project is funded by a Federal Lands Access Program grant and construction is anticipated to occur in summer 2025. **Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest Elbow Fork Fuel Reduction Project.** The Uinta-Wasatch-Cache National Forest will likely be doing wildfire prevention work (cut and pile fuel reduction) in the Elbow Fork area of Millcreek Canyon between August and October 2022 as part of the Water Restoration Initiative. This work is similar to what was done in the upper end of Lamb's Canyon road in the summer of 2021. 

At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
