### **\$460,000 GRANT HELPS MILLCREEK LAUNCH RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECT**

*RMP Blue Sky community projects funding  
makes solar panels possible at City Hall*

MILLCREEK. Millcreek will soon generate its own clean, renewable power thanks to a funding award from Rocky Mountain Power's Blue Sky

program participants. The money will support the installation of solar panels at our new City Hall.

The award of \$460,000 will cover 77 percent of the installation cost of the 120 kW solar panel system with a 30 kW battery.

Millcreek joins more than 200 organizations across Rocky Mountain Power's service area that, since 2006, have received awards for community-based renewable projects, including solar, wind, geothermal and other forms of renewable energy. This project is one of six selected this year through a competitive-evaluation process.

"We are thrilled that we were selected for this award and so grateful to Rocky Mountain Power's Blue Sky participants who made it possible," said Mayor Jeff Silvestrini. "This solar panel project is not only a win for the environment but for the local community, too. By generating our own electricity, we'll save on energy costs — and that means we can dedicate more of our budget to the needs of our residents.

Construction on Millcreek's new City Hall began in March 2022. It is expected to begin generating power in fall 2023.

Blue Sky is an opt-in program that gives Rocky Mountain Power customers an option to match all or part of their energy use with renewable energy -- reducing their carbon footprints and driving demand for new renewable energy in the West. Through the Blue Sky Block option, participants also support qualifying, renewable energy projects for community-serving organizations such as schools, community centers and arts organizations.

"For more than 20 years, the Blue Sky program has offered Rocky Mountain Power customers a simple and powerful way to live their values, reduce their carbon footprint and support renewable energy," said Travis Jones, Regional Business Manager at Rocky Mountain Power. "Unlike most green power programs, Blue Sky goes beyond the purchase of renewable energy credits to help fund additional smaller energy projects for organizations in our

communities. Through projects such as this, Blue Sky participants are powering a better future for local communities.”

## Churchill Jr High Pedestrian Bridge Repairs will Impact Traffic this Weekend

MILLCREEK. UDOT will be performing repairs tomorrow to the pedestrian bridge at the intersection of Wasatch Blvd and Oakview Drive. Expect minor traffic delays.

- **When?** Saturday September 24th, 9-10 am
  - **Where?** Wasatch Blvd and Oakview Dr. (near Churchill Jr. High)
  - **What?** The signals at the intersection will not be operational and flaggers will be controlling the intersection. The pedestrian bridge and nearby sidewalks will be closed.
  - **Impacts?** Minor traffic impacts, up to 5 minute delays, due to flagging operations. No pedestrian access on the pedestrian bridge or nearby sidewalks while work is occurring.
  - **Why?** Bridge rehabilitation






## **Drought and Water Supply Update**


MILLCREEK. Earlier this week, the Salt Lake City Dept of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) announced that their users are doing their part during this extreme drought.

The SLCDPU supplies water to most of Millcreek, as well as Salt Lake City, Holladay, Cottonwood Heights and parts of unincorporated Salt Lake County. From April 1 to Sept 18 this year, SLCPDU says that its users saved 2.9 billion gallons of water compared with the past three-years' average demand. Most of those savings (2.1 billion gallons) occurred in just the past year.

There was a brief uptick in water use during the sustained hot weather we recently experienced, but the demand reduction response to the recent rain was immediate, indicating users are keeping water water conservation in mind.

SLCPDU indicates that the water supply at this time is adequate to meet demand, although Wasatch front stream flows are below normal and groundwater resources are being used. SLCDPU will remain at Stage II of the [Water Shortage Contingency Plan](#).

We appreciate Millcreek residents stepping forward to reduce water use. The rain barrel sale was a huge success this year and will be back next spring.
