IMPORTANT - 2300 EAST ONRAMP TO WESTBOUND I-80 CLOSURE NOTICE

The UDOT project team will close the westbound I-80 on-ramp from 2300 East in Salt Lake City starting **tomorrow night, Saturday, October 8, through mid-December 2022**.

Instead of reconstructing the ramp in phases, which impacts traffic for a longer duration, crews are closing the ramp to fully reconstruct it and impact traffic for a shorter duration. Moreover, space is limited on the ramp, and it cannot accommodate both drivers and construction crews. Thus, the closure will

increase safety for crews and drivers alike.

While the ramp is closed, drivers can access westbound I-80 from the on-ramp at 1300 East in Salt Lake City or the northbound I-215 on-ramp from 3300 South in Millcreek, as shown in the map above.

Fall Leaf Program to Start on Oct 15th

MILLCREEK. As the temperatures cool down and leaves begin to fall, our partners at Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling (WFWRD) will begin their seasonal fall leaf pickup.

Starting October 17, residents can pick up leaf bags at the East Mill Creek Rec Center (2230 E Evergreen Ave.), Millcreek City Hall (3330 S 1300 E), the Millcreek Activity Center (4405 S 1025 E), or the Millcreek Library (2266 E Evergreen Ave). We request that residents take only **one roll** of leaf bags per household due to limited supplies.

You can take your full leaf bags to Canyon Rim Park (3100 E 3100 S) or the Cottonwood Softball Complex (4400 S 1300 E, **northside only**) and place them in the designated trailers.

IMPORTANT - Please do not dump garbage or other items at this or other locations. Please keep leaves and other yard waste out of your recycle cans.

Based on your age, medical needs, and where you live, Medigap helps you find options to cover some out-of-pocket medical costs not covered by Medicare, and explains coverage levels while helping find local providers.

A Message from Salt Lake County Mayor Jenny Wilson About Expunging Criminal Records:

Dear Salt Lake County Residents,

If you or someone you know has a criminal record, now is the time to get it cleared. Thanks to new legislation took effect in May, many of the fees required to expunge eligible criminal records have been waived until July 2023. But I

know it can be confusing to navigate this process without spending money on legal assistance.

That's why my Criminal Justice Initiatives team created the free [Expungement Tool Kit](#): to help people complete the process without having to hire an attorney or pay any additional fees for legal services.

You may have heard about Automatic Expungement, which is in effect for low level offenses. But individuals with more serious criminal offenses that are not eligible for automatic expungement will still need to go through the traditional petition-based process, which is what spurred development of this [toolkit](#).

It would normally cost a minimum of \$655 to expunge three eligible criminal cases. Until July 2023, it will only cost a person \$65 total (BCI application fee). Our self-service guide is broken down into easily understandable steps to assist individuals looking to complete the expungement process without an attorney.
