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## Wilford Ward to Take Place Soon

*You will soon see some construction vehicles in action on Highland Drive across from Crown Burger.*

MILLCREEK. Earlier this year, the Wilford Ward of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints moved their congregation into the meetinghouse on the corner of Gregson Avenue and Kenwood Street. The Church sold the vacant building to Millcreek in June, but conditioned the sale upon the City demolishing the structure within six months thereafter. That date is coming right up.

The City purchased the property for the public purpose of relocating a natural gas regulator station. Dominion Energy operates a current regulator station for the Highland Drive corridor west of SLC Strength & Conditioning and east of Millcreek Common. Once the church is demolished, the outdated utility facility will be replaced by a new regulator station—at no cost to the city—on the old church property.

The remainder of the former church property will be surplus by the City and sold to another business or use that would fit in well with the Highland Drive corridor and the adjacent neighborhoods.

## **PLAN AHEAD FOR UPCOMING I-80 CLOSURE**

INTERSTATE I-80. This weekend, I-80 will be closed in both directions between 700 East and Foothill Drive. The closures are scheduled to occur overnight on Friday, Oct. 28, and Saturday, Oct. 29, from 9 p.m. to 9 a.m. each night. This will allow UDOT to place beams for the new 1300 East bridge.

In addition, 1300 East between Stringham Avenue and Parkway Avenue will be closed overnight during both I-80 closures, and drivers will be detoured to 700 East. Eastbound drivers can use 2100 South, 3300 South, or I-215. ## **Meet Photographer Rick Cohen**


*Featured Artist for November at the Millcreek Community Center Library

MILLCREEK. Rick Cohen tells us, "My journey into photography started in my late teens when I found a 1940's 35mm camera in a box in the attic of my parents house. My subjects were usually my family, friends and the ocean, mountains and desert around San Diego. With my switch to digital I began to experiment more with macro and wide and telephoto zoom lenses. My favorite subjects became insects, animals, flowers and landscapes"

Rick moved to Utah in 1989 and found an abundance of his favorite subjects within a short drive in almost any direction and even more so after moving to Millcreek almost 25 years ago. Rick says that several years ago he joined the Wasatch Camera Club (WCC) and found a large group of like minded photography enthusiasts. "Seeing what other photographers produce


has encouraged me to improve my own images"
