Millcreek Mayor Calls for Volunteers and Declares State of Local Emergency Due to Flooding Concerns

MILLCREEK. Mayor Silvestrini declared a state of local emergency yesterday due to imminent risk of flooding from the four active creeks that

run through our community — Parleys Creek, Mill
Creek, Neffs Creek, and Big Cottonwood Creek.

The declaration will allow the city to gain financial help if the spring runoff adversely affects our city. The mayor also called for volunteers to help fill sandbags and to help their neighbors who may be less able to deal with flooding issues.

Here is Mayor Silvestrini's message regarding the declaration:

Earlier this week, Emigration Creek flooded parts of Emigration Canyon and Salt Lake City just north of our city boundary. In rendering mutual aid to residents of Salt Lake City, Millcreek's Emergency Management team and Salt Lake County Flood Control crews depleted Millcreek's reserve stock of filled sandbags, which were previously filled by our volunteers. We need to immediately replenish our reserve in the event we see similar flooding in Millcreek.

The risk of flooding in Millcreek is real and imminent, but still unpredictable. We have experienced record-breaking snowpack in our mountains, which contains water content in excess of the flood year of 1983, when significant flooding occurred in our community. Our creeks will be rising and running beyond their usual volumes very soon. Whether the weather will cooperate with a slow melt is hoped for, but unknown. We want to do everything possible to be ready and that includes putting our city on an emergency footing to allow our employees to be flexible and to allow us to use our resources as needed to address this imminent crisis. This declaration will additionally position us to receive mutual aid from our neighbors and reimbursements from county, state and/or federal resources if and when needed and appropriate.

I call on all able Millcreek residents to volunteer time and labor at city-sponsored sandbag filling events to replenish our reserve and additionally to be at the ready to address emergency flooding events as they occur. Please help your neighbors who may be less able than you. Please report stream blockages or potential blockages to the city at (801) 214-2700. **Please clear debris, lawn furniture, firepits, etc. from creek floodplains in your yards. Please keep storm drains and ditches clear of debris.** And importantly, please be aware of swift water dangers which threaten people and pets. **Stay away from swift water!**

The first 500 volunteers who come to the Millcreek-sponsored sandbag-filling event on Saturday, April 15 at 3800 S. Wasatch Blvd. from 8:00 am-4:00 pm will receive a buy pizza get one free coupon for the new Pizza Nono on Millcreek Common (valid

from 4/20-5/31).





Springtime & Mosquitoes

"Did you know that mosquitoes are the most deadly animal on earth? They claim more lives every year than sharks, snakes, dogs, crocodiles, lions and humans combined."

This message taken from the [South Salt Lake Valley Mosquito Abatement District website](#) spotlights that mosquitoes are much more than just a nuisance. Most mosquito-borne diseases are rare in the United States thanks to mosquito control efforts but the important focus in Utah is on mosquito-borne West Nile virus.

The majority of Millcreek is served by the South Salt Lake Valley Mosquito Abatement District with the exception of a portion north of 3300 South and east of 500 East which is served by the [Salt Lake City Mosquito Abatement District](#).

With the extreme amount of moisture this winter and expected wet spring weather, the mosquito abatement districts believe there may be many places where standing water can collect and provide the perfect breeding ground for mosquitoes.

Mosquito control assistance is provided by these districts and may include treatment of standing water or introduction of mosquito fish into backyard ponds. If you feel you need help with mosquito control, contact your district.

Charge Your Yard Incentive Program For Lawn Care Businesses

The [Utah Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Air Quality](#), is offering **lawn care businesses up to \$3,000** toward the purchase of electric lawn equipment in exchange for recycling their gas-powered string trimmers and leaf blowers.

How does this program improve Utah's air quality?

- Small, gas-powered lawn equipment causes a lot of air pollution. In fact, using a gas-powered leaf blower for just one hour is the same as driving the average vehicle 727 miles - from Ogden to Disneyland!
- We are targeting lawn care businesses who are using this equipment for many hours a day to have the greatest impact on Utah's air quality.
 - Commercial lawn care operations contribute approximately **four times** the emissions from lawn equipment than residential.
- If we eliminated the use of all small (2-stroke) lawn equipment, we would see a 20% reduction in nonroad emissions that cause ozone pollution.
