Project Overview

Millcreek City, in coordination with the Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT), is constructing a roundabout on 3800 South at Virginia Way, near Skyline High School. In addition to the new roundabout, this project includes additional improvements (see map below). Construction is scheduled to start in mid-May and is expected to be completed by the end of July 2023.
