Meet the Millcreek UPD Ice Cream Van

MILLCREEK. At the City Council meeting this week, Chief DeBry, Lieutenant Petty-Brown, Sergeant Allen, and Officer Schroeder, members of the Millcreek Precinct of the Unified Police Department (UPD), gave the council a sneak peek at the newest addition to the UPD fleet, an Ice Cream Van.

Chief DeBry told the council that the van is a way to get out into the community and have positive interactions with youth. The goal is to build trust and establish a dialogue with kids to talk about not using drugs and alcohol and about making positive choices in life.

The UPD Millcreek Precinct purchased the van with alcohol tax funds that the state of Utah distributes to pay for drug and alcohol education and enforcement. Detective Jared Nichols designed and painted the van's artwork.

UPD worked with evidence-based programs Positive Action and Parents Empowered to develop the ice cream van program and will be using some of their teaching methods.

The UPD asked us to thank Creamies Premium Ice Cream, Yeti Goal Zero, Parents Empowered, and Corporate Image for their help with the creation of the Ice Cream Van.

Residents will see the Ice Cream Van at the Venture Out! events, as well as at some of our local elementary schools, or just driving through the neighborhoods

and apartments complexes during the summertime handing out yummy Creamies and interacting with kids.

We would like to thank the UPD officers who thought of this fantastic idea and followed through to make it a reality.
