Millcreek's Justice Court Moves to Holladay

MILLCREEK. If you get a traffic citation in Millcreek or commit some other type of infraction, or if you become involved in a small claims case in our jurisdiction, you'll be headed to justice court. Under Utah's Code [§78A-7-106](#), justice courts handle petty criminal offenses, as well as

Class C and B misdemeanors, and small civil
claims ([currently up to \\$15,000](#)).

Since the city's incorporation, Millcreek has contracted with Salt Lake County to provide its justice court services. Recently, the County informed the city that it would be getting out of the court business and that Millcreek would need to find a new option. Rather than starting its own justice court, as many cities have—a path that would be costly both in initial set-up costs and ongoing expenses—city leaders explored partnering with neighboring cities.

The court services provided at Holladay City Hall have proved to be the best option for Millcreek taxpayers. Effective July 1, 2023, Millcreek's justice court needs will be handled there.*

“For years, Holladay’s court has successfully provided this service for Cottonwood Heights,” said Millcreek’s City Attorney John Brems. “Adding Millcreek’s cases to the Holladay courthouse will help residents of all three cities to enjoy economies of scale,” he said.

The City Council expects that this change will both save money for the city and be more convenient for most Millcreek residents. “The Justice Court located inside Holladay's city hall at 4580 S 2300 E, will actually be closer for most Millcreek residents than the old county location at 2100 S and State,” Mayor Jeff Silvestrini pointed out. He added, “Millcreek’s lean and highly efficient government model continues to work best as we partner where it makes sense instead of trying to do everything ourselves.”

Pepper and the Roses are an indie rock band based in SLC. In this project singer/songwriter Pepper Rose has teamed up with guitar powerhouse Erica Rose, Drummer/Poet Wynter Storm, and sometimes bassist Dave Crespo, to create a folk rock sound that's got a little something for everyone. Pepper's bright melodies and honest acoustic guitar guide the audience through the full spectrum of emotions as Erica's classic guitar stylings and Wynter's soul and gospel inspired beats create a rock-scape that's easy to get lost in. Dave Crespo on bass provides the glue that helps drive these songs home as they explore the clash between the inner psyche and a chaotic external world.



Salt Lake City based **Terrestrial Soulz** blends funk, rock and hip hop. Their music is rooted in the powerful and expressive lyrics of Martian Textiles underpinned by the composition and bass grooves of Dan DeJesus. Repurpose or Reuse Your Sandbags

Residents who want to keep their sandbags for potential future use should store them off the ground in an area away from the elements and be sure they are dry completely to prevent mold, be sure they stay covered and dry. Sand can be repurposed by mixing it with compost (60-70% sand and 30-40% compost) for use in planters and gardens or scattered in other garden areas.

DO NOT dump sandbags in any waterway

DO NOT dispose of sandbags in curbside residential bins




