New St. Mark's Hospital Patient Tower Open

MILLCREEK. St. Mark's Hospital has completed its five-story Patient Tower, an expansion of the hospital that has been in the works for the last several years. A ribbon-cutting ceremony earlier this week marked the grand opening.

Mayor Jeff Silvestrini, Councilmember Cheri Jackson and many Millcreek staff members were honored to join hospital officials in welcoming the finished project, which is located on 3900 S between 11th and 13th Easts.

The new Patient Tower, containing more than 125,000 sq.ft. of new and 42,000 sq.ft. of renovated space, has the following amenities and facilities:

First Floor:

- Registration
- Coffee shop
- Reconfigured ER waiting room

Second Floor:

- Same-day surgery
- Endoscopy
- Cath lab recovery unit

Third Floor:

- Intensive care unit

Fourth Floor:

- Progressive care unit

Fifth Floor:

- Med/Surg unit



St. Mark's Hospital was the first hospital in the Salt Lake Valley, started the first nursing program in the area, and upon re-location into Millcreek in 1973, was the first hospital to provide private patient rooms.

Those rooms, however, have proven over the years to be too small to accommodate the new generation of medical equipment. In the new patient

tower, the rooms have been designed to be adequate for any medical need as well as allowing for a better experience for patients, their family, and visitors.



Mayor Silvestrini serves on the Board of Directors of St. Mark's as a representative of our community. In his remarks at the ribbon cutting, Mayor Silvestrini thanked everyone involved in the hard work of creating this beautiful building, including HCA Healthcare, Mountain Star Healthcare, and Millcreek's Economic, Planning, and Building Departments. He also acknowledged the members of the Unified Fire Department who bring critical patients to the hospital to receive life-saving medical care.

St. Mark's is an amazing partner to our city. We are thrilled to see this incredible new expansion that will help those in need all over the county.



Canyon Rim Cares is a Resounding Success

MILLCREEK. Thanks to all the volunteers, sponsors, businesses and non profit organizations who helped make this year's Canyon Rim Cares such a success. With around 500 people in attendance, the things we were able to accomplish were nothing short of extraordinary. Here's a recap on all of the projects:

- More than \$13,000 was raised and hundreds of volunteers helped assemble over 1,100 school supply kits that will be donated to local and international refugee students. With the excess supplies donated, we'll be able to assemble another 300 kits
- Nearly 100 people donated or created approximately 200 winter hats and 100 items of winter clothing, all to be donated this fall to local individuals experiencing
- More than 100 people contributed to the creation of a beautiful 70 foot wide mural on the south end of Canyon Rim Park as well as a wrap for the electrical box in the park
- 60 "connection kits" to help families experiencing mental health crises were assembled in less than 30 minutes
- Close to 100 bracelets were assembled to give to patrons of a local food pantry.



The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
