Tax Notices are Showing up in Mailboxes - No Increase on the Millcreek Line

MILLCREEK. Property owners throughout the county are receiving their 2023 Notice of Property Valuation & Tax Changes from the Salt Lake County Auditor. Millcreek taxpayers may notice that there is no tax increase on the Millcreek city line.

The City Council has worked diligently to establish and keep tax increases at bay while providing all of the services our residents require and as many as possible of those that they request.

The notice has a new feature—a QR code at the top left of the notice—that gives property owners the ability to easily access additional information about each taxing entity's line item.

Millcreek's finance team has prepared a [Budget-in-Brief](#) that will pop up when you click the Millcreek line on the tax notice. The [Budget-in-Brief](#) will give you some of the City Council's Strategic Plan objectives and a set of Quick Facts about Millcreek. A page is dedicated to the revenue side of the city budget showing where the funds come from to provide essential services for our residents.

With regard to property taxes, the council determined upon incorporation that property taxes would be dedicated exclusively to law enforcement, following the pattern set by the county before incorporation. Property taxes are the most stable revenue that the city receives and it was decided that stability was needed in order to provide the high quality policing services Millcreek residents deserve.

You will see that 43% of the city revenue comes from sales taxes. When you hear the words "buy local" this is why. When you go out to dinner with the family or purchase goods from a store in Millcreek, the city portion of those taxes comes to the Millcreek to pay for needed services, such as wintertime snow plowing or summertime park maintenance. The more you "buy local", the more revenue is available to the city for these types of services.

The Budget-in-Brief then shows how revenue is utilized with the biggest portion—59%—going toward professional and contract services, including public

safety. After that, 26% is paid through contracts with Salt Lake County for public works services.

Information is shown regarding capital projects, including how City Hall, the Millcreek Common, and stormwater management are being funded. Note that the bulk of the expenses for the new City Hall and Millcreek Common are being covered through bonding and grants.

The final page discusses funding sources for road maintenance, listing upcoming road and transportation projects. It is important to note that in the last chart shown, out of \$27.1M in funding sources for upcoming transportation projects, only 8.1%, or \$2.2M, comes from the general fund. The remaining sources listed as federal, state and regional come from grants that the city has successfully applied for and received. Our staff aggressively watches for grant funding opportunities to supplement the city budget and has been very successful in their efforts.

Join the Millcreek Arts Council every Monday at 7pm at Canyon Rim Park for a free Summer Jam Concert Series. This week featuring Callanish.

Callanish is the name of a group of standing stones in Scotland, ancient and weathered, but still evocative of the culture that created them. **Callanish** is also a local Salt Lake City Utah band that has weathered more than 25 years with a changing cast of musicians and focus, but still turning out Celtic and Irish Traditional music. The band currently consists of five friends using their diverse musical backgrounds to create music primarily in a traditional Celtic style. They feature John Adams on violin, Soren Green on classical and acoustic guitars, Taylor Nyx on vocals, Ben Spigle on flutes and whistles and Cindy Spigle on bodhran and percussion. They play mostly traditional Irish and Scottish tunes augmented with a growing body of original compositions as well as non-traditional tunes played on traditional instruments. **Callanish** is constantly honing their connection to the tradition, including traveling together to Ireland to soak up the culture.




Metropolitan Water District of Salt Lake & Sandy Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan
