

MILLCREEK. Olympus High School 2023 graduate LilyKate Jones has created a fun map of Millcreek and presented it to the people of Millcreek to hang in our new City Hall.

High school students recommended by their teachers were invited earlier this year to submit their art portfolios to the City for consideration of creating new art for our new City Hall. Six of them, including LilyKate, were then invited to submit a small sample of a “fun city map of Millcreek.” These six students, who received \$100 honorarium for their efforts were: Olympus students Isabel Wilson and LilyKate Jones; and Skyline students Penny Madsen, Addie Madsen, Annie Li, and Raine Bastian.

From that group, LilyKate was commissioned for the final 7 foot x 4 foot art work, which will be placed in the public market on the ground floor of the new Millcreek City Hall. LilyKate received \$1,000 for her summer’s work on this significant project. She dropped it off literally the day before she moved to Savannah, Georgia, where she will continue growing her talents at the Savannah College of Art and Design.

CENTRAL WASATCH MOUNTAINS. The Central Wasatch Commission (CWC) has opened the application period for its newly created Youth Council. Applications will be accepted through September 28th.

The CWC Youth Council will provide an opportunity for people ages 16 to 30 to participate with the CWC as it works to address transportation, economic, recreation, and environmental issues in the Central Wasatch Mountains. The Youth Council will serve as an educational forum for its members and provide a platform for young people to engage directly with the CWC on issues that affect them as residents of Utah and as users and stewards of the Central Wasatch. The Youth Council will also bring together people who are passionate about their local environment and want their voices to be heard.

Youth Council members will have the opportunity to:

- Work within designated Youth Council committees;
- Attend regular Youth Council meetings and events;
- Educate themselves and others about the CWC and its work;
- Bring issues important to them to the Stakeholders Council and to the Board for consideration;
- Engage with the CWC's Board of Commissioners and the CWC's advisory Stakeholders Council.


Youth Council member requirements:

At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the Chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The Chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
