There are good reasons why cars should not be parked on the street during snow season. This car did not fare well in a recent encounter with a snow plow on a dark, snowy winter night.





MILLCREEK. We are finally getting the snow we so badly need. Our snow plow crews are out in force doing their best to keep Millcreek streets clear and safe, and we need everyone's help.

Millcreek Ordinance "11.20.130 *Parking Prohibited When*" states:

No person shall park a vehicle on any city street when it is snowing or snow is on the street during the months of November, December, January, February, March, and April.

This parking prohibition was not adopted to make things difficult for residents but to keep the streets clear so the snow plow drivers can do their work.

As Mayor Silvestrini likes to point out after spending time as a passenger in a snow plow clearing streets, "A snow plow is not a surgical instrument."

We all know how tricky it can be driving on snowy sometimes dark streets and having to make quick turns or stops—imagine doing that in a 3-ton snow plow truck. On top of that, in order to push large amounts of wet snow, plows must have momentum, so the drivers cannot make rapid adjustments.

Don't park on the street



Cars parked along the streets present a serious hazard to the plow drivers, and as you can see in the photo at the top of this newsletter, to your car as well. Along with that, streets cannot be cleared thoroughly when cars are parked in the way and some streets cannot be cleared at all where the snow plow driver cannot safely maneuver. The plow drivers have been instructed not to even attempt to clear a street when they determine it is not safe.

Our snow plow drivers are hard workers who have to be out there while we are at home staying safe and warm. We expect a lot from them and always want to be able to go out, dig our cars out, and drive away on a plowed street so we all need to do our part to help them out.

Plows clear streets across the city based on a street priority. This prioritization takes into account the most efficient method of working through the city.

- **First Priority:** High traffic roads, school zones, steeper hills, and arterial and collector roads receive top plowing priority.
- **Second Priority:** Streets through residential subdivisions, including roads that connect to a collector street.
- **Third Priority:** Cul-de-sacs, circles, and dead-end streets. Please note this could take up to 48 hours after a major snowstorm ends.

Safety first! When it keeps snowing, plows will continue to plow the bigger streets so safety vehicles can access main roads. Plow drivers take into account emergency situations.

Things residents should do:

- Don't park on the street. Plow drivers may not be able to safely plow a street when cars are parked on the street.
- Understand that some roads are lower priority and be patient in large snow events
- If possible, refrain from driving during snow events. This helps plow drivers to clear roads more efficiently and safely.
- Don't blow/shovel snow onto the road when clearing driveway or sidewalks. Snow can refreeze and cause ice build up
- Please keep a safe distance from snowplows. Be aware that snowplows may back up at anytime. Do not pass snowplows while they are plowing.

Additionally, always remember to clear your sidewalks – but don't throw the snow on to the street. Don't forget to remove snow from around a fire hydrant that may be on your property. You definitely want the firefighters to be able to hook their hoses up quickly in the event of a fire.



We also have gotten a message from our partners at the [Wasatch Front Waste & Recycling District](#) (WFWRD) asking us to remind residents to move their waste and recycling cans in front of any snowbanks where the trucks can reach them. Please watch the [WFWRD website](#) and [Facebook page](#) for messages about any weather related pick-up delays.

We appreciate that sometimes it is not convenient to follow these rules but please consider the consequences of not helping out. We appreciate all of our residents who keep this in mind. Thank you very much!!.
