MILLCREEK. Millcreek will be opening the world's first "City Hall Climbing Wall" tomorrow, March 23rd at 10 AM at Millcreek City Hall (1330 E Chambers Ave). The public is invited to attend this free all-day celebration.

"As a dedicated rock climber, I am beyond excited to bring this one-of-a-kind climbing wall to our community," says Gannon Nawojczyk, Senior Recreation Manager at Millcreek Common. "We've smashed the barriers of entry usually associated with climbing by offering low-cost admission, equipment, and experts to help any climber regardless of their experience. Our goal is to make this epic sport accessible to all."

The 65-foot climbing wall was in large part funded by a \$200,000 Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant from the Department of Natural Resources Division of Outdoor Recreation. It will have holds and paths for a variety of abilities. Visitors will have the opportunity to use auto belay, top rope, or lead climbing, or race their friends to the top of the 55-foot area of the wall designed for speed climbing. Millcreek will not only have the largest outdoor climbing wall in Utah, but also be the first city hall to have a climbing wall on the outside of the building.

USA Climbing has confirmed that professional climbers Piper Kelly and John Brosler will be breaking in the climbing wall at 10:30 AM and will host a meet-and-greet at the USA Climbing tent until 12:00 PM.



Piper Kelly is a professional speed climber who lives in Salt Lake City. This summer, she'll be representing Team USA at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games. John Brosler is a professional speed climber who also lives in Salt Lake City. Brosler will be competing at the Olympic Qualifier Series this May, for the chance to qualify for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.

The Climbing Wall Grand Opening Celebration will proceed as follows:

- 10:00 AM: Ribbon Cutting—see the first speed race with Milo-the-Moose
- 10:30 AM: Piper Kelly and John Brosler break in the climbing wall
- 11:00 AM to noon: USA Climbing meet-and-greet
- 11:00 AM, 3:00 PM, 5:00 PM: Top Rope Belay Classes

All Day:

- Celebrate the sport of Climbing – FREE admission all day
- Connect with Climbing Clubs and Vendors in the Public Market
- Enjoy Giveaways, Games, and Fun
- Great Food Trucks

Starting tomorrow, the Millcreek Climbing Wall will be open daily, 11 AM to 8 PM Sunday-Thursday, and 11 AM to 9 PM Friday and Saturday (closed Easter, March 31st). Located at Millcreek City Hall (1330 E Chambers Ave), admission to climb is \$7 for 60 minutes, and shoes can be rented for \$5. Reserve your

“Where else, other than Millcreek, can residents and visitors say they climbed and conquered City Hall?” says Nawojczyk. “We can’t wait to share this one-of-a-kind experience with you.”

### **Blue Herbicide**

MILLCREEK. If you jog, hike, bike, or walk your dog on Grandeur Peak, please be aware that beginning this coming Monday, 3/25, crews will be spraying a herbicide treatment that is poisonous to address invasive species, mainly

myrtle spurge. The treatment is dyed a vivid blue to allow users to avoid contact. **Avoid the blues and be sure to keep children and dogs away!**

Keep dogs on leash, stay on the trail, and do not touch/come into contact with any vegetation that has blue dye on it

MILLCREEK. 



**Construction Updates**



## 2000 East Improvements

**Project Overview** - Millcreek City is performing a roadway and irrigation improvement project on 2000 East between Siggard Dr and 33rd S. The project began November 2023 and will continue through summer 2024.\*

**Project benefits include:**

- Piping of the west-side irrigation ditch
- Installation of a pedestrian-friendly sidewalk
- New bike lanes for active transportation
- New pavement for road overlay

**During construction, residents and drivers can expect:**

- Daytime construction work Monday through Friday
- Shifting traffic patterns and travel delays throughout the work zone
- Construction crews, vehicles, and equipment in the area
- Noise, dust, and vibration

**Equipment and Materials Staging** - An equipment and material staging area has been established in the cul-de-sac at Millcreek Dr and 3375 S. Access to homes and driveways will be maintained, snow and trash removal will still take place as normal, and the staging area will be secured. Residents with questions are encouraged to contact the project team.

**Parking Restriction** - Parking on the north and south sides of 3375 S between 2000 E and Millcreek Dr is restricted between the hours of 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday to accommodate construction equipment moving through the area.

**Pedestrian Access Ramps** - New pedestrian access ramps on the east side of 2000 E at the intersection of 2000 E & Siggard should be accessible today. The ramp work on the eastern sidewalk should be completed in the two weeks.

*\*Construction schedules are subject to change due to utility, material, weather, or equipment delays*





## 900 East Reconstruction

MILLCREEK. Crews resumed work today on 900 East between 4500 South and 3900 South as part of the full depth roadway reconstruction. Crews will be pouring concrete for driveways and sidewalks along the project. Drivers in the area should anticipate intermittent lane closures and changing traffic configurations. Please stay vigilant and expect travel delays in the project area.

Nearby residents and businesses can expect roadway excavation and intermittent travel delays when entering and exiting their properties. All impacted residents will be notified ahead of any driveway closures or water shut-offs through a door hanger notification. **Access will be maintained to all the surrounding properties**, unless otherwise notified by the project team.

## WHAT TO EXPECT:

- One-way flagging operations as needed
- Intermittent driveway, sidewalk and lane closures
- Increased noise, dust and vibration


Construction is anticipated to be completed by the **end of summer 2024**.\*
