

Five Year Plan for Pavement Preservation Now Available

MILLCREEK. We often hear from residents letting us know the roads in their neighborhood are terrible and asking when we plan to fix them. We are aware that many roads in Millcreek need attention; upon incorporation we inherited many deteriorated or failing roads and we are working hard to address them.

During the first years after incorporation, the focus was on the main roads and funds were acquired through grants and other sources to fix the majority of them.

An example is 3900 South which was rebuilt as a complete street from 2300 E to I-215 in a partnership with Holladay City using grant funds at no direct cost. Projects are currently underway along 2000 E heading west from 3300 S (with plans in the works to extend the project north to the city limit next year), work is underway and several small storm water projects are slated for this summer.

Neighborhood roads in need of repair are dealt with through what is known as the **Pavement Preservation Plan**. Each year the city Public Works Department in coordination with our contract partner, Salt Lake County, assesses and prioritizes repairs for all city streets. A rolling five year plan is then developed.

Some roads are scheduled to receive a chip seal or slurry seal while others will be micropaved or have an overlay applied. Which treatment is applied to a road is based on the condition of the roadway. Road treatments are designed to prolong the life of that road until a more complete treatment can be done and roads in the worst shape are dealt with first.

Work on some roads are delayed due to future plans. For example, the Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is in the planning phases for a large water line running from the water tanks at the top of 3300 S right below I-215 down through Millcreek neighborhoods to the area of the roundabout at the exit off of I-80. We understand that the funding for that large project is not yet in place but have been told that work may start in the next few years. We know that some roadways along their planned project route are in need of repairs but we will wait for additional information from SLCDPU before spending funds on them. Work on these roads will likely be torn up soon. In the meantime we will fix potholes and do necessary patching along those impacted roadways (seen in red on the above map).

As you scroll, you will see all of the projects (road, sidewalk, bike lanes, etc.) that have completed over the last six short years.

We are proud of the work that has been done or is in the process and we appreciate the patience of Millcreek residents as we work through this very long that need repairs.



City Council Modifies Sign Ordinance

MILLCREEK. At this week's Millcreek City Council meeting, a unanimous vote updated the city's sign ordinance. After listening to public input, a controversy the ordinance was adjusted by the Council—instead of allowing two new additional digital signs (like the one already at 3300 S Millcreek Common), the Council allowing one new digital sign and directed staff to look at putting that on Richmond Avenue and not Highland Drive.

The city's interest in digital signs comes from both the need to advertise for city events as well as the potential of outdoor advertising companies removing city streets in exchange for time on a digital sign. Removing billboards has been a goal of city leaders since incorporation and was done successfully with a digital sign agreement. Future negotiations with outdoor advertisers will determine if a digital sign will even happen at Chambers Avenue and 1300 East.

Mountain Power
Wildfire Mitigation

Greetings Millcreek Residents,

We want to keep you informed about the ongoing efforts to enhance wildfire safety and to continue to deliver reliable power to your community. Rocky Mountain Power is currently engaged in a wildfire mitigation project to upgrade power lines and poles along the East Bench in Millcreek.

Details about the project: Our crews will be working to replace wooden poles with durable self-weathering steel poles and covered wire and upgrading infrastructure to mitigate the potential wildfire risk. This work is scheduled throughout the spring and summer months.

What to Expect: As part of these upgrades, you may notice various activities in the area, including:

- Digging holes to prepare for the installation of new poles.
- Removing old wire and poles to make way for the new infrastructure.
- Using specialized equipment such as line trucks, cranes, and in areas with limited access, helicopters may be employed to assist with removing and
- Installing new wire to ensure reliable power transmission.

Community Impact: We understand that these wildfire mitigation measures may cause temporary inconveniences and we're working diligently to minimize disruptions to the community. Your safety is our top priority.

Environmental Considerations: We're committed to minimizing our environmental footprint throughout this project by taking the following steps:

- We're replacing poles one by one to reduce disturbance.
- Areas that have limited access will be worked on by helicopter, reducing the use and disturbance of heavy equipment.
- Our team is carefully coordinating with agencies, such as the U.S. Forest Service, to minimize environmental impacts. Our avian biologists are also HawkWatch International to monitor local bird nesting activity, including kestrel and screech owl nest boxes. This may result in staggered construction timeframes to avoid active raptor nests.

We appreciate your support and understanding as we work to enhance the safety of your community by reducing wildfire risk. If you have any questions about the project, please don't hesitate to reach out to us.

IMPORTANT CONSTRUCTION NOTICE AFFECTING 3300 SOUTH

MILLCREEK. During the 2000 E Reconstruction Project that is underway running south from 3300 S, it has come to our attention that there is a storm drain underneath 3300 S at the intersection with 2000 E that is failing. It is fortunate that this problem was discovered before the road was impacted or suffered failure but unfortunately it means that there will be traffic impacts along 3300 S while repairs are underway.

Repairs are scheduled to begin on 4/17 and will hopefully be completed in 21 days (weather permitting). There will be traffic disruptions including lane closures and lane shifts along 3300 S. **If possible, use alternate routes and as always, obey all traffic control signs, slow down, and drive carefully in construction.**



Time to Leash Up!

A Message from Salt Lake County Animal Services

Spring has arrived, signaling the perfect opportunity for you and your canine companion to explore the neighborhood, parks, and trails. Before you head out to enjoy the beautiful weather, don't forget to grab a leash and those essential poop bags!

Leash Laws

Many violators of this ordinance will claim that their pet is friendly, or less aggressive when on a leash. However, Salt Lake County Animal Services would emphasize that not everyone appreciates encountering a "friendly" off-leash dog, including those with leashed dogs. A leash isn't just an optional accessory requirement. If you and your dog are found off-leash in areas other than designated off-leash dog parks, you will receive a ticket and be subject to a fine.

Pack Out the Poop

It's a legal requirement to clean up after your dog. Failure to do so may result in fines. This is considered a public nuisance violation. Whether you're in the city or on a busy hiking trail, be a considerate neighbor or hiker by carrying poop bags to clean up after your dog when they poop.


