World Refugee Day was first celebrated on June 20, 2001 to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees.

Millcreek 900 East Final Project Update

PROJECT COMPLETION

We are pleased to announce that construction on 900 East between 4500 South and 3900 South is coming to an end! All major construction activities on the project will be complete by June 21, 2024. Crews will remove traffic control devices and will be conducting final construction activities as they finish the last details of this project over the next few weeks.

Construction Underway on 1300 East between 4220 and 4500 South

MILLCREEK. This project includes pavement reconstructed with complete street elements of bicycle lanes and ADA compliant sidewalks. Storm drains will be evaluated and replaced if needed. A midblock pedestrian crossing near the park will be placed to facilitate safer East/West pedestrian movement.

Crews have begun removing the asphalt surface of the roadway on 1300 East, between 4220 South. During this work, drivers should anticipate uneven road surfaces and are advised to reduce their speed while passing through this area. The traffic pattern has been adjusted to one-way, with alternating traffic controlled by flaggers as necessary, and this configuration will be in place throughout the project. Drivers in the area may experience delays while traveling and should take alternative routes when possible.




**A Message from Granite
School District about
the progress on the Skyline
High School Rebuild**

Dear Skyline Community,

As many of you may have seen, the main academic wing of the building is in final preparations to be ready for the start of the school year in August. We are now making plans for the demolition of the old academic building. Currently, asbestos abatement is ongoing. Once asbestos abatement is completed inside the building, the contractor will start tearing down the main academic building itself. We expect that work to begin no sooner than the first week of July. The process of demolition is not expected to be completed until early fall.

We expect there might be interest from the community in watching the demolition. If you choose to do so, please stay behind the fence and do not trespass onto the property. We encourage you to park on Virginia Drive so as to not impact our neighbors. The construction of the original building is made up of concrete and panels that are not conducive for mementos. If you'd like a memento from the old building, the school is selling parts of the old basketball court. This fundraiser will not occur until later when the project is completed in 2026.

Central Wasatch Commission Interactive Transit Map Now Available

The Central Wasatch Commission (CWC) has released an interactive Transit Map for the DWD's Study Area. With this map, the CWC aims to consolidate the available transit options within the CWC's study area that are available to the public in one place – [on the CWC's website](#).

The [CWC Transit Map](#) will help facilitate trip-planning for Utah residents and visitors by providing the overall picture of what transit is available. The map also illustrates where there are gaps in transit service, highlighting where there is a need for further transit investment.

The map will continue to be updated as new transit data within the study area become available. CWC staff are working to incorporate ski and trail shuttle

GIS data and the CWC's Ski Bus Priorit Access program details into the Central Wasatch Transit Map.
