



Tax Notices are Showing up in Mailboxes — No Increase on the Millcreek Line

MILLCREEK. Property owners throughout the county are receiving their 2024 Notice of Property Valuation & Tax Changes from the Salt Lake County Auditor. You can see in the second green column in the sample notice above that increases are being proposed this year by Unified Fire, Granite School District, Salt Lake County, and the

Central Utah Water Conservancy District. But Millcreek has not proposed any increase for the coming fiscal year.

The City Council has worked diligently to keep tax increases at bay while providing all of the services our residents require and as many as possible of those that they request.

The notice has a helpful feature—a QR code at the top left of the notice—that gives property owners the ability to easily access additional information about each taxing entity's line item. Scanning the QR code on your own notice will bring up a digital copy of your tax notice. Each taxing entity name on your digital notice is a link you can click on to review that entity's information about its budget.

Millcreek's finance team has prepared a [Budget-in-Brief](#) that will pop up when you click the Millcreek line on the tax notice.

The [Budget-in-Brief](#) will give you some of the City Council's Strategic Plan objectives and a set of Quick Facts about Millcreek. A page is dedicated to the revenue side of the city budget showing where the funds come from to provide essential services for our residents.

With regard to property taxes, the council determined upon incorporation that property taxes would be dedicated exclusively to law enforcement, following the pattern set by the county before incorporation. Property taxes are the most stable revenue that the city receives and it was decided that stability was needed in order to provide the high quality policing services Millcreek residents deserve.

You will see that 46% of the city revenue comes from sales taxes. When you hear the words "buy local" this is why. When you go out to dinner with the family or purchase goods from a store in Millcreek, the city portion of those taxes comes to Millcreek to pay for needed services, such as wintertime snow plowing or summertime park maintenance. The more you "buy local", the more revenue is available to the city for these types of services.

The [Budget-in-Brief](#) then shows how revenue is utilized with the biggest portion—59%—going toward professional and contract services, including

public safety. 24% of that 59% is paid through contracts with Salt Lake County for public works services. Information is also provided regarding capital projects, including how City Hall, the Millcreek Common, and storm water management are being funded

Note that the bulk of the expenses for the new City Hall and Millcreek Common are being covered through bonding and grants. Page five discusses funding sources for road maintenance, and lists upcoming road and transportation projects. Note that out of \$25.9M in funding sources for upcoming transportation projects, only 7.3%, or \$1.9M, comes from the general fund. The remaining sources (federal, state and regional) are grants for which the city has successfully applied. Our staff aggressively watches for grant funding opportunities to supplement the city budget and has been very successful in its efforts.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the 801 Area Code was the original area code for all of Utah, and has become a major part of Utahns' identity; and

WHEREAS Millcreek, as Utah's "*oldest, newest city*," the first settlement outside of the original "Utah Fort" in 1847 but not incorporated until 2016, has proudly rocked "the 801" as our area code since the dawn of self-dialing, long distance telephone service; and

WHEREAS the 801 Area Code inspires pride among Millcreek's some 65,000 residents in the fastest growing state in the nation, and great affection among the millions who visit our city each year to enjoy and explore such wonders as Mill Creek and Neffs Canyons, Grandeur Peak and Mount Olympus, the Jordan River, Millcreek Common or Second Summit Cidery in the heart of Millcreek's exciting, west-side, Meadowbrook Neighborhood; and

WHEREAS the overwhelming pride in 'the 801' is a characteristic of our community and not just the first three digits of our phone number; and

WHEREAS the popularity of the 801 area code has made it a hot commodity for people when moving here and a badge of honor for those of us who still rock our same numbers from 8/01/1999; and

WHEREAS an 801 Day provides an opportunity to celebrate our City, County, and State and the contributions of the people, businesses, and social institutions that make living in "the 801" exceptional; and

NOW, THEREFORE I, Mayor Jeff Silvestrini, hereby proclaim August 1, 2024, also known as 8/01/2024, as "801 Day in Millcreek." I urge residents, community organizations, businesses and visitors to join in the celebration and demonstrate their pride for our city. I further encourage residents and visitors to take this opportunity to explore Millcreek's unique natural amenities, our wonderful, diverse neighborhoods and to support local restaurants, bars, and shops in "The 801."


