

The CWC Releases Updated Visitor-Use Study

Initially released in October 2023, an updated version of the final Central Wasatch Commission's Visitor Use Study final report is now available to the public. The Visitor-Use Study report details the findings of an effort designed to better understand the visitors and visitor experiences offered on Forest Service land within the Central Wasatch Mountains. The report serves as a base of information that can be used to inform the decisions of both the USDA Forest Service as well as the many entities represented on the Central Wasatch Commission.

Road Closure – 3100 E between 3900 S and Upland Drive

MILLCREEK. Please be aware that 3100 East, between 39th South and Upland Drive, will be closed until mid-September due to a stormwater utility construction project. The closure will affect commuting hours before and after school for Upland Terrace Elementary, Wasatch Junior High, and Skyline High School.
