Carnegie Medal for Heroic Actions

MILLCREEK. For her selfless rescue of a BASE jumper hanging from a cliff, Millcreek resident River Barry has been awarded the Carnegie Medal for Heroism. This prestigious honor is given throughout the United States and Canada to those "who risk death or serious physical injury to an extraordinary degree saving or attempting to save the lives of others."

The Carnegie Hero Fund contacted the City at the end of July to ask for help in presenting the medal to Barry. This past Monday evening, the Millcreek City Council did just that, and presented the medal to Barry on behalf of the Fund.

The Carnegie Hero Fund provided the following description of the rescue:

"A 39-year-old BASE jumper hung by his parachute 70 feet above the ground on Nov. 26, 2022 in Moab, Utah. He had jumped from the top of the 400-foot cliff, but his parachute deployed in the wrong direction, slammed him into the cliff face, and then got caught on an outcropping, leaving him badly injured and dangling. Thirty-year-old River Barry, who was in the area to go mountain biking, was flagged down by the man's friend asking if anyone had climbing gear. Barry, a mental health therapist of Millcreek, Utah, went to the scene and used her own climbing gear and recreational experience to ascend a crack that ran up the side of the cliff directly below the injured man. No one had climbed the crack before and locals referred to the sandstone on the cliff as "slick rock" for its slippery conditions. With the help of the man's friend belaying her from the ground, Barry climbed to a point above the man and clipped her harness to his. She cut away his parachute and descended to the ground, bearing the man's weight, to waiting rescuers. The man suffered a compound fracture of his leg and underwent extensive physical therapy. Barry was not injured."

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES



Above is a map showing the nighttime road closure at 3300 South on August 21st.

33rd South, between Highland Dr. and 13th East — Nighttime Road Closure. The westbound lanes on 3300 South, between Highland Drive and 1300 East, will be closed for the Westerly Apartments project from 9 p.m. on Wednesday, August 21, to 6 a.m. on Thursday, August 22. During this time, drivers should be prepared to follow posted detour signs and may experience delays while traveling in the area.

3100 East. Construction crews will continue installing storm drain pipes and inlets on 3100 East and along Upland Drive until the end of August. After completing the underground pipework, crews will start preparing the roadway for asphalt work and final project tasks. Residents and drivers in the area can expect intermittent closures until the end of construction.

1300 East. Construction crews have finished installing underground utility and pipework and expect for concrete and roadwork to finish in mid-September. Drivers in the area will continue to experience changing traffic patterns and one-way flagging operations until construction is complete.

Neffs Lane. A contractor has been awarded the project to complete the Neffs Lane Safety Improvement Project, and construction will begin at the beginning of September.

4100 South 1100 East. Millcreek will address a road safety concern by fixing a failing storm drainpipe located at 1100 East, near 4100 South. The repair will involve relining 115 linear feet of the existing pipe under the road and private driveway. This repair is expected to improve road safety in the affected area significantly. Construction will begin in mid-September and finish at the beginning of October.

Pickleball Courts. Crews continue on completing concrete work and preparing the parking lot area for asphalt which is anticipated to be placed as early as Friday, August 23.
