## **Learn About Plans for Millcreek Common Phase II and Give Your Input**

MILLCREEK. Learn about the proposed plans for Millcreek Common Phase II. Join city staff and representatives from the architectural firm working on the proposal to view the current plans, ask questions, and give your input on Wednesday, September 18th, from 6-8pm on the first floor of City Hall, 1330 E Chambers Ave.


Millcreek Common Phase II will be an extension to the north and west of the current Common area where residents currently enjoy the skating rink. The Common lies along a fault line that runs underneath the skating rink and then

curves northward to the west where buildings cannot be situated.



## PHASE II


Construction

While Phase I of Millcreek Common is the classic European-style plaza (with a skate loop in the middle), Phase II will include much more green space as our residents continue to be “Connected by Nature.” Residents will be able to enjoy the Grassy Meadow, the Splash Creek, a Milo the Moose Play Structure, the Skate Canyon, Milo’s Mini Golf, or hang out at The Treehouse.

Phase II will be built on property that already belongs to the city. Grants that will pay for these amenities include a \$2,500,000 Land Water Conservation Fund Grant from the National Park Service, a \$2,500,00 ARPA pass-through grant from the State of Utah to provide open space near new housing construction, as well as anticipated grant support from Salt Lake County Tourism, Recreation, Culture, and Convention (TRCC) Support Program, and the Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant program (the same that provided grants for the Skate Loop and the Climbing Wall). Additional financing will come from the city’s Park Impact Fees and Woodland Avenue Community Reinvestment Area increment.

We are excited about these proposals and to have residents take a look and give us your thoughts.



## September is National Preparedness Month

The theme for week three (Sept./ 8-14) is:

**Have a Plan - Create a family communications plan, know your evacuation routes, make a kit, etc.**

### HAVE A PLAN

- Your emergency plans can include contact information to stay in touch during a disaster, where you & your pets will stay if you must leave home, & the latest safety info to share with friends and family.
  - In a disaster, sometimes it's bet to stay home, but going to a different place may be the best way to stay safe. When deciding to stay or evacuate, always pay attention to directions fro your local police, fire department, or elected officials.
  - Before a disaster happens, you should know where you, your family and your pets will go if you are told to evacuate. This cold be friend or relative's house, a community shelter in your neighborhood, or a hotel in another town.





## 1100 East Road Closure

Millcreek will address a road safety concern by fixing a failing storm drainpipe on 1100 East, near 4100 South. Construction crews will perform maintenance on the storm drainpipe by relining 115 linear feet of the existing pipe under the road. During these activities, crews will **fully close 1100 East starting as early as 8 a.m. on Monday, September 16, and continuing through Tuesday, September 17.** Drivers are advised to follow posted detour signs and plan accordingly for any delays while traveling in the area.
